Report of Viewers Sewellsville Road.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, we, Elmer E. Hibbs, George Berstler and Joshua Dunbar, Trustees of Kirkwood Township, Belmont County, Ohio, in obedience to your verbal order, not dated, we proceeded with John A. Bond, Surveyor, Brank Bell' and David Ferrell, tapemen and Loren Hibbs, Marker, all sworn. We proceeded to view and survey a proposed road, petitioned for Elias Stein et al as prayed for in the petition or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as to the public if said road or any part thereof . is established or opened or altered as follows:

(For description see Surveyor's report, page 68 this volume) We did respectfully report that our opinion is that proposed road ought to be built for the following reasons: 1st, the present road is impassable on account of land slides; 2d, proposed road much lighter grade and better ground for maintaining road; 3d, Impossible to maintain present read.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such proposed road shall be established and opened, thirty-three feet wide, all of which is respectfully submitted.
