Beginning for the same, at said point on said road at the South East corner of lands owned by said Kleiner, thence through the lands of Christian Wolf Sr. to a buck stump on the brow of the bank in Walter Run, thence down to a large elm tree on the North side of Walter Run and standing in a road laid out by the Administrator of Joseph Stickwood deceased, thence down said road along the meanderings of said Run to the Ohio valley Pike.


