The undersigned Trustees of Peace Township in said County, respectfully report, That upon Petition of G. W. H. Springer and five others residents of said Township, they took to their aid John S. Vanpelt as Surveyor (who was duly sworn to discharge the duties of his appointment) and on the 8th day of July 1876. (being the time fixed by them for that purpose) they proceeded to examine a County Road leading from Martins Ferry to Steubenville through said Township which had been injured at a point 3 miles above Martins Ferry O. by the washing of the Ohio River, and being of opinion upon said examination, that said road had been so much injured at the place mentioned, that the public good




