REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your September session, A. D. 1877, we, the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with J. M. Riley Surveyor, at L. H. Green on Sep. 27, 1877 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, and none else by whom the vacancy was filled.

Loman H. Green one of the viewers heretofore appointed by you, not being able to attend, and not appearing at the time and place named in notice, nor for one hour thereafter, John Neil was appointed viewer in his stead by Mr. M. Armstrong and M. S. Henderson, viewers Orluff Dorsey and Samuel P. Fish were selected by us as chain carriers, and William Beabout, as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alleratior of Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and incovenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Establishment of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said Alleration ought to be Established for the following reasons:

- 1st. the Change shortens the line about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile
- 2d. Ovriates four crossings of Captina Creek
- 3d. the grade of new line equally light as old line, and the bridge now in process of building with the bridge already built would enable the travel to reach Worthington at all times of the year which could not be done on old road.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Alleration shall be established Thirty feet in width.
