REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your March session, A. D. 1879, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with Chalkley Dawson Surveyor, at Quincy on April 22nd and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

James Dallett and John Devore were selected by us as chain carriers, and Mr. W. Campbell as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Line of Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the construction of said road as follows:

Beginning at a large sycamore tree standing on the South side of Little McMahons Creek, and running thence in a N. Easterly direction through the lands of James Dixon crossing the creek and narrow swage. R. R. nearly at right angles. and at the commencement of the line, thence in an easterly direction through the lands of Samuel Alexander, fronting his house thence in a South Easterly direction along a hill side of said Alexander's land, to the lands of Joseph Hutchison thence through said land intersecting the County Road on the line between Joseph Hutchison and Thos. Starulu thence with said County Road through Starulus land striking the lands of Mary Allman, thence through said Mary Allman's land in a N. Easterly direction, through the lands of Thos. Thomas and Henry Morris to a stake standing in the County Road, and called for in the Petition. For further Report see Surveyors Report

We would respectfully report that the said Line of Road ought to be Granted

for the following reasons: First, the establishment of said line of Road, would be of general Public utility. Second. That a road on said line, can be easily and cheaply opened and at a very low grade in no place exceeding five degrees. Third. That if a road was opened upon the proposed route, persons passing to and from the River, would avoid all crossings and fords of McMahons Creek, which from its nature, is for a considerable portion of the year dangerous and difficult. Fourth. That by this route, all close approaches to the B. & O. R. R. would be avoided. We would therefore recommend the Commissioners to pay out of the County Fund the within named compensation and damages, and have the road located upon the line as recommended, thereby avoiding the necessity of dredging McMahons Creek as they would in course of time. We recommend to make a safe and convenient route to the River. We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Line of Road shall be established Thirty three feet in width.
