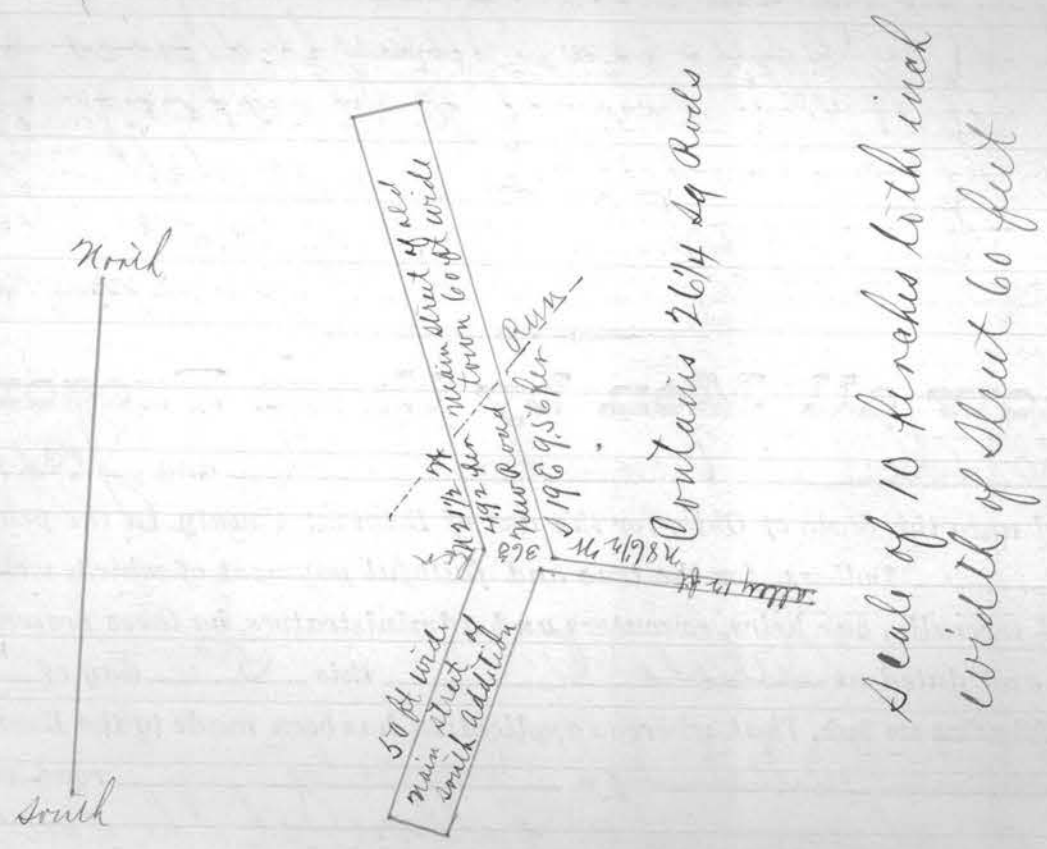

Surveyor's Report.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated March 8th 1881, proceeded, on the 14th day of April to survey and mark the route of a County road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Beginning at a stake in a stream in a hollow on the south side of Main Street of the town of Fairmount. Thence S 19° E 95.6 per through the lands of Harley Heskett to the north end of the Main Street of M^o Millers addition to said town thence N 86 1/2° W 3.44 per thence N 21 1/2° W 4.92 per, to a stake at the run. Thence up said run N 27° E 4.84 per to the place of beginning.

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your March session, A. D. 1881, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with James Crosgrove Surveyor, at Guss Mills on 14th day of April and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

Henry Paugh and Richard Corbin were selected by us as chain carriers, and Thomas E. Nessitt as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Establishment of said road as follows:

Commencing at a stream in a hollow, at the south end of Main Street of the town of Fairmount. Thence along the route as described in said petition so as to intersect and connect said town of Fairmount and McMillens Addition to said town and the public road through the same.

We would respectfully report that the said Road ought to be Established for the following reasons: as above stated in order to connect said town and said addition thereto, and for the convenience of the neighborhood and the traveling public in general, and without such establishment of said road would form a blockade and hinder the travel in said town,

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Road shall be established Sixty feet in width.
