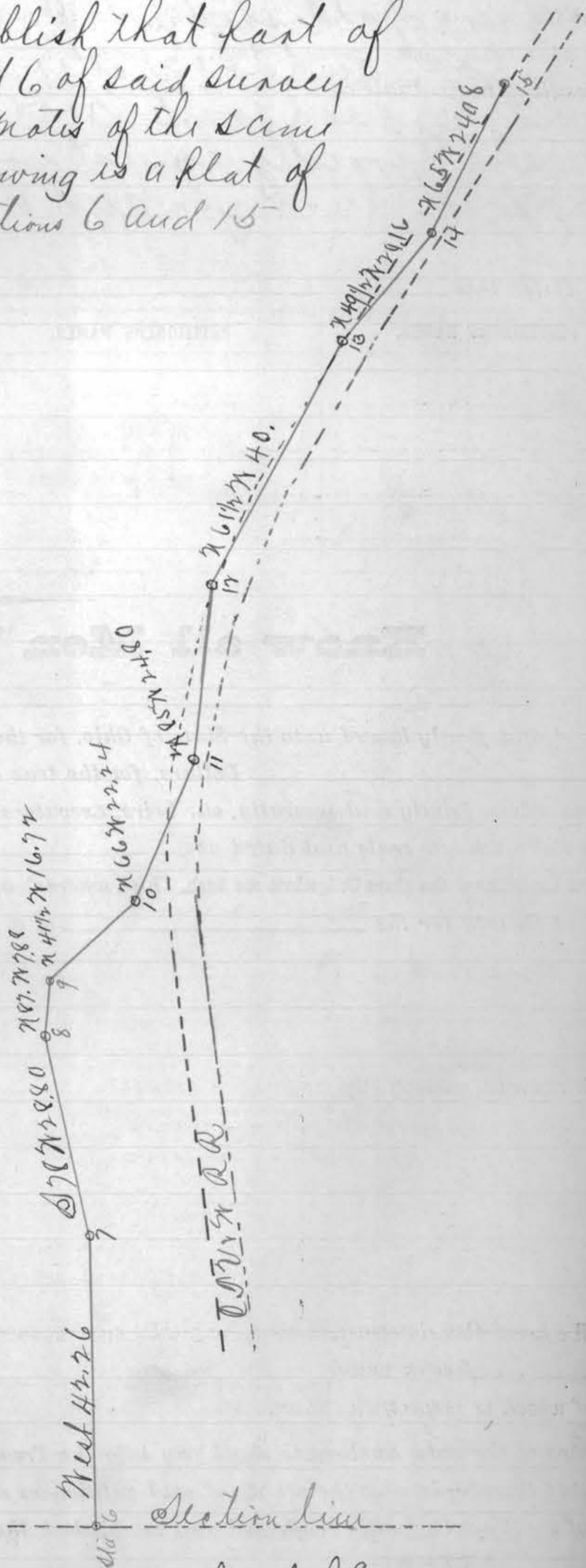

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated March 6th 1883, proceeded, on the 27th day of March to survey and mark the County Road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your March session, A. D. 1883, we the undersigned, ^{as} Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Mitchell Surveyor, at Barton Station on the day appointed and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

George Mitchell and John Harris were selected by us as chain carriers, and Samuel Coats as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to ^{survey and locate} view said ~~proposed~~ Counly Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the _____ of said road as follows:

Beginning at Station 1 as mentioned in the record of said road we found from thence Station 2, but the monuments being lost between Stations 2 and 6 and a manifest error existing in the courses and distances of said road between said Stations 2 & 6 we find it impossible to locate or establish the same between said points. We found a monument at Station 6 on the Section line between the lands of J Barton and J Deukam, and surveyed and located the same from said point through the lands of Barton and Deukam to Station 15, and find the Cleveland, Tuscarawas, Valley and Wheeling Rail Road located on and occupying that part of said road between Stations 10 & 15, and for description of said road reference is made to the surveyors plat.

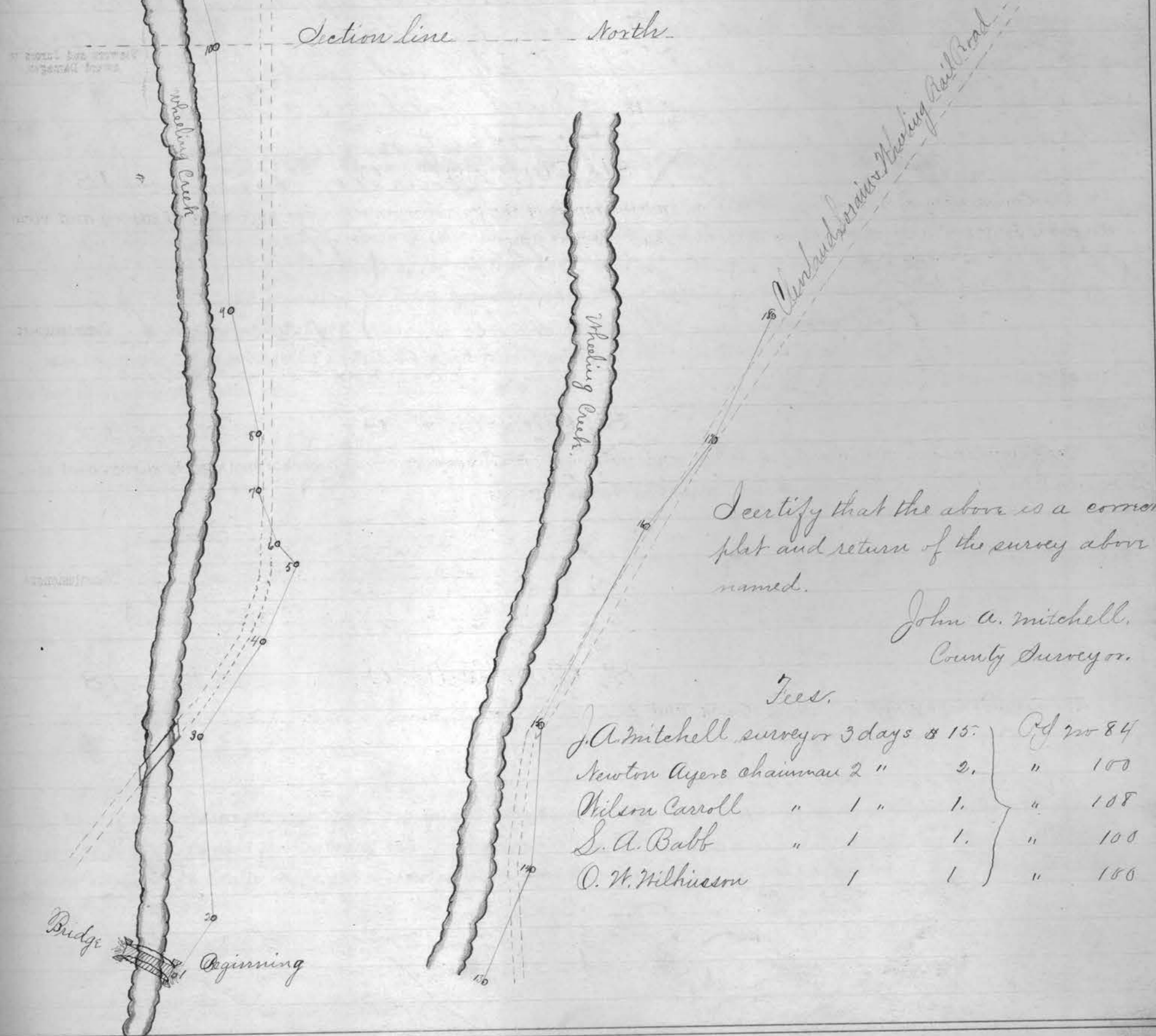

Supplementary report of the Surveyor of the lost road in Colerain Township petitioned for by Malice Horton & David Bowen, Trustees of said Twp. To the Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio: The undersigned in obedience to your orders proceeded on the 1st day of September A.D. 1883 to resurvey and mark a part of a County road described below as surveyed by Saul A.
