For a Alteration of a County Road in Colerain Twp ✓

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said county, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the alteration of the County road called the ~~Martin's Ferry & St. Clairsville~~ road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order the proper proceedings in the premises to establish the proposed alteration of such road, to-wit: Beginning at the iron bridge over Wheling Creek on said road on the lands of John O'Barton in Section 24 Township 6 Range 3 in which Jesse Barton and Jane Barton his wife have an interest. thence through said lands nearly East about fifteen rods; thence nearly North about fifty rods, to a point near the upper end of the turn in the present road, thence with said road nearly South East about fourteen rods to the lands of Thomas A. Mitchell, thence through his lands, and leaving the old road to the left, nearly South East about forty rods to the top of the Creek Hill, and thence nearly North East about twelve rods to the present road - the end of the proposed alteration.



The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated June 5<sup>th</sup> 1883, proceeded, on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of June to survey and mark the Alteration of a County road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Beginning at a stake near the east end of the iron bridge over Wheeling Creek, on the Martins Ferry & Claysville road on the lands of Jno O'Barlow in Sec 24 T 6 R 3 in which Jesse Barlow & Jane Barlow his wife have an interest from which a stone flauted bears  $\frac{1}{2} 6\frac{1}{4}$  N 24 links distant, and a Box Elder S 3. # REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your June session, A. D. 1883, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Mitchell Surveyor, at Baileys Station on June 27<sup>th</sup> 1883 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

N. J. Taggart and John Harris were selected by us as chain carriers, and L. A. Babb. as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Establishment of said road as follows:

Beginning at a Stake near the east end of the Iron bridge over Wheling Creek on the lands of Jdg & Barlow in Sec 24 T 6 R 3 in which Jesse Barlow & Jane Barlow his wife have an interest, from which a Stake planted beans N 68° 47' W 24 links distant, and a Box Elder S 8 E 106 links, thence the following courses and distances as shown by Surveyor report (For description of same see Surveyors report)

We would respectfully report that the said Alteration ought to be granted for the following reasons:

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Road shall be established 35 feet in width.

And now comes John P. Barlow et al by their Attorney and filed a remonstrance against the establishment of said road, whereupon L D Mitchell et al

by J M Riley Esq their Atty. made a motion to quash said remonstrance  
 on account of informality, after hearing arguments of Counsel for  
 and against said motion Board over rule same. to which ruling  
 L D Mitchell et al by their Atty take exceptions. Board then proceeded  
 to hear evidence as to the Public utility of said road. whereupon  
 L D Mitchell et al by their Atty objected. After hearing arguments  
 of Counsel for and against said objections Board over rule same  
 to which ruling L D Mitchell et al by their Atty. take exceptions.  
 L D Mitchell et al by J M Riley their Atty. then made a motion to  
 strike out the Compensation and damages allowed by the viewers  
 to Jas O'Barlon on account of improper application. after  
 hearing evidence and arguments of Counsel for and against  
 said motion Board over rule same to which ruling L D Mitchell  
 et al by their Attorney take exceptions. Board then heard the  
 evidence for and against the establishment of said road.  
 And the Board being of opinion that the compensation and damages  
 awarded to the several claimants to viztider #0539  
 To John O'Barlon \$150.00 compensation and \$150.00 damages is reasonable  
 and just but that said road is not of sufficient importance to  
 the public to warrant the payment of all of said Compensation and  
 damages out of the County Treasury. it is ordered that the  
 petitioners pay or tender to pay the claimant forthwith one  
 half of the compensation and damages so assessed to him  
 and that no further proceedings be had in the premises  
 until such payment or tender shall have been made.
