

day of June to survey and mark the Alteration of a State Road described in said

Beginning for the same on the lands of Abner Stilwell in Celerain Township at a stone planted in the road at the Railroad Crossing near the mouth of Naylor's run in Sec 25 T 7 and R 3; thence according to the courses and distances and monuments mentioned in the Surveyors report through the lands of J. W. Kidd, Thos. Major, Wm. Edward Harkens Isabel Adams, Jacob McMillen, Jess Pyle, M Balderson and Archibald Major, intersecting the Bridgefoot and Celerain Free Turnpike near the Mt Pleasant road where a stone planted bears S 75 $\frac{1}{4}$ W 32 links distant, and for a more particular description of said road reference is made to the Surveyors report.

We would respectfully report that the said County road ought to be established for the following reasons: That it will of general public utility by being the shortest and most direct route between Pleasant Grove and the L.C. & R.R. at Kidd's Coal Works, and being placed almost entirely on the west side of the run, will make an easy grade and a very dry and good road bed, and will greatly improve the road leading from Mt Pleasant to St. Clairsville.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such County road shall be established thirty feet in width.
