The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said county, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Alteration of a County road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order the proper proceedings in the premises to Alter such road, to-wit: Beginning at a point near a spring on the farm of Samuel Sturderon, in section 2, Wheeling Township thence south westwardly through the lands of said Samuel Sturderon to the County road thence with said County road to a point near the barn of Alexander Y Sturderon thence southwardly through the lands of said Alexander Y Sturderon to the top of Wheeling Creek thence eastwardly to Maynard Station on the C. S. & W. R. R through the lands of the heirs of Brice Scott deceased.

S. & W. R. R through the lands of the heirs of Brice Scott decd.

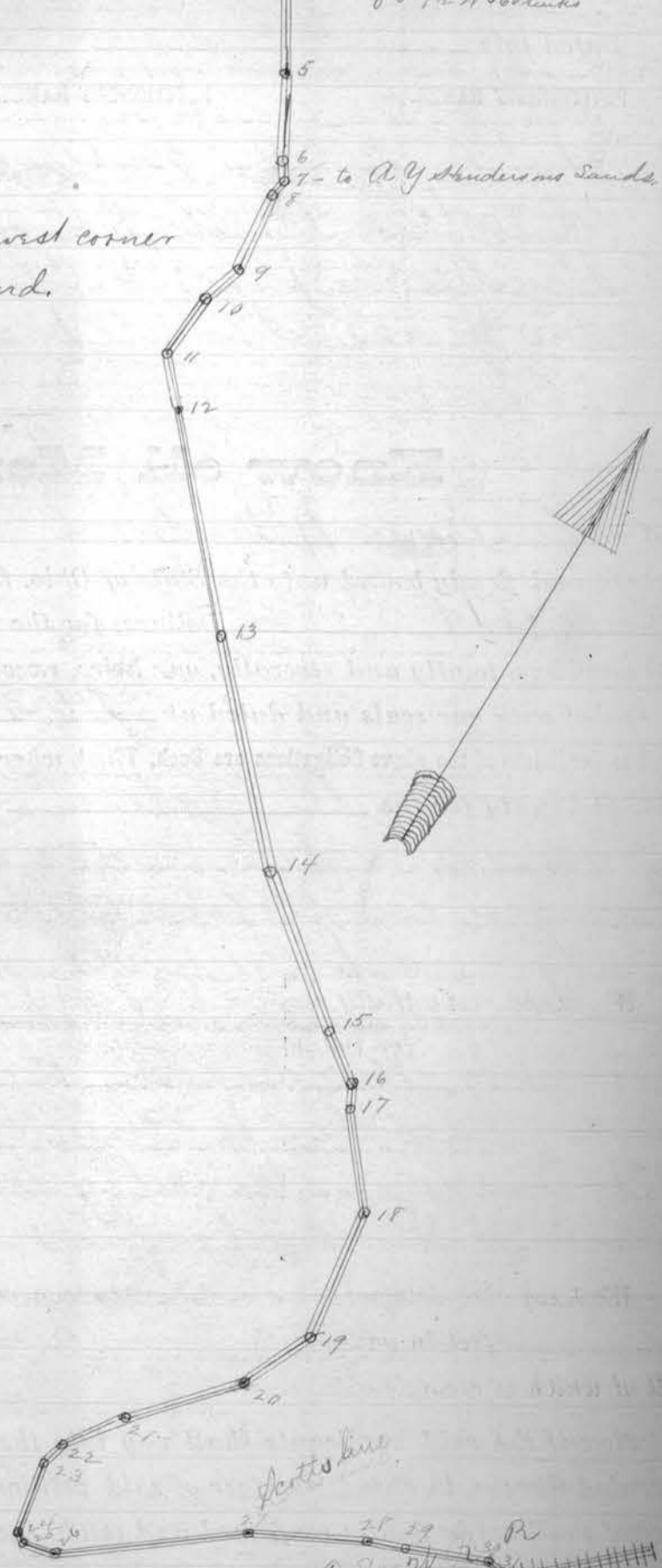
Surveyor's Report.

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your December session, A. D. 1883, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with pro A Mitchell Surveyor, at A. Y. Stunderson on 23d Jan'y 1884 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order. And proceeded on the 26th of Feb'y to perform the duties of our appointment,

A. Y. Stunderson and J. H. Burris were selected by us as chain carriers, and P. G. Shrader as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

Beginning for the same, at a stone planted in the road near the line between the lands of John and Samuel Stunderson in Sec 2, Wheeling Township thence by the courses distances given in Surveyors Report to a stone planted in the road near the south west corner of lot no 45 in the town of Maynard.

Wheeling Sec 1 & 2 T. 8 R. 4
Coleman Sec 31, T. 6 R. 3

We would respectfully report that the said Alteration ought to be established for the following reasons:

It shortens the road, saves crossing creeks + runs; and is a better grade and the public convenience requires it and the same can be made at a reasonable expense and avoids the C. S. + H. R. R.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Alteration shall be established from Station 1 to 26⁺ feet in width. + Sta. 26 to 32, 33 feet wide.
