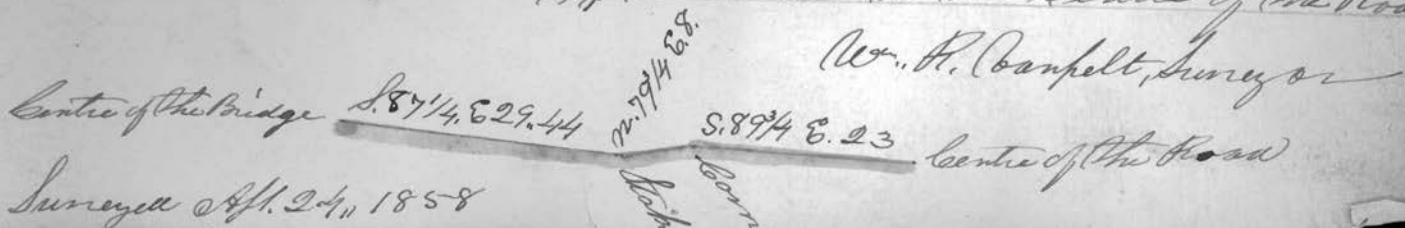


Plat of a Survey of a Road, as ordered by the Commissioners,

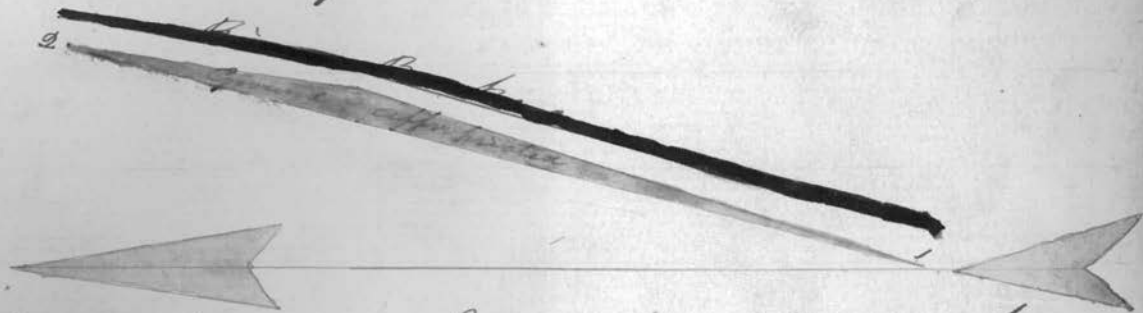

Patton's Run and Deep Run, in said Township,

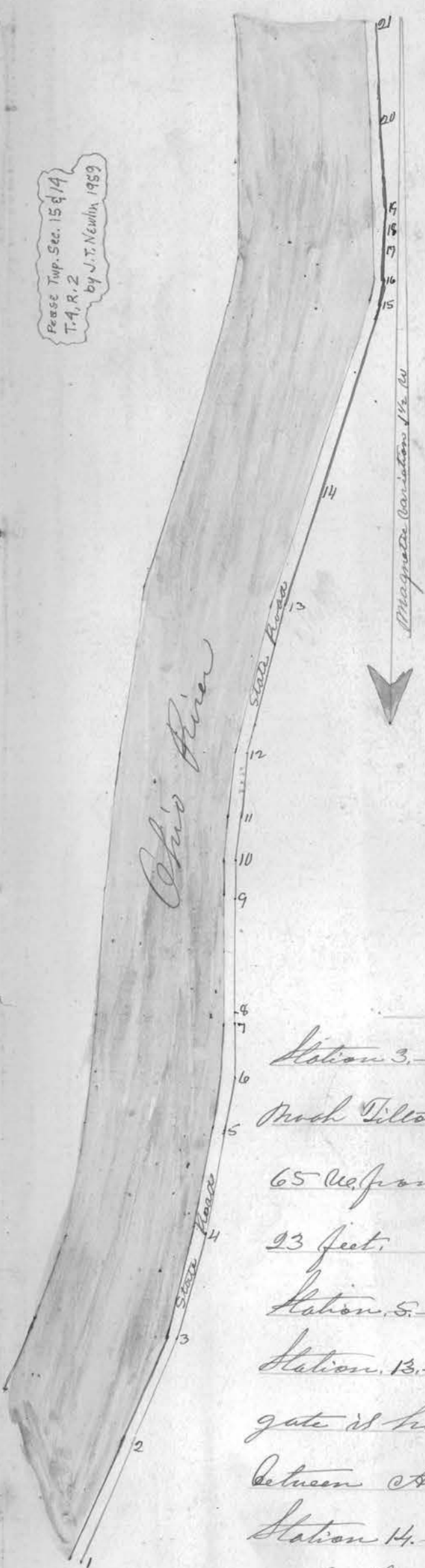

A Description and Plat of a Renew and Survey made July 14th and 19th, 1858, of that portion of the State Road leading from Bridgeport, Belmont County, to Steubenville, Jefferson County, O. along the ^{west} bank of the Ohio River; lying between Robert Patton's lane and the county line between said counties commencing for the same at a post in fence 8 links north of county line. Said post marked with 3 notches.

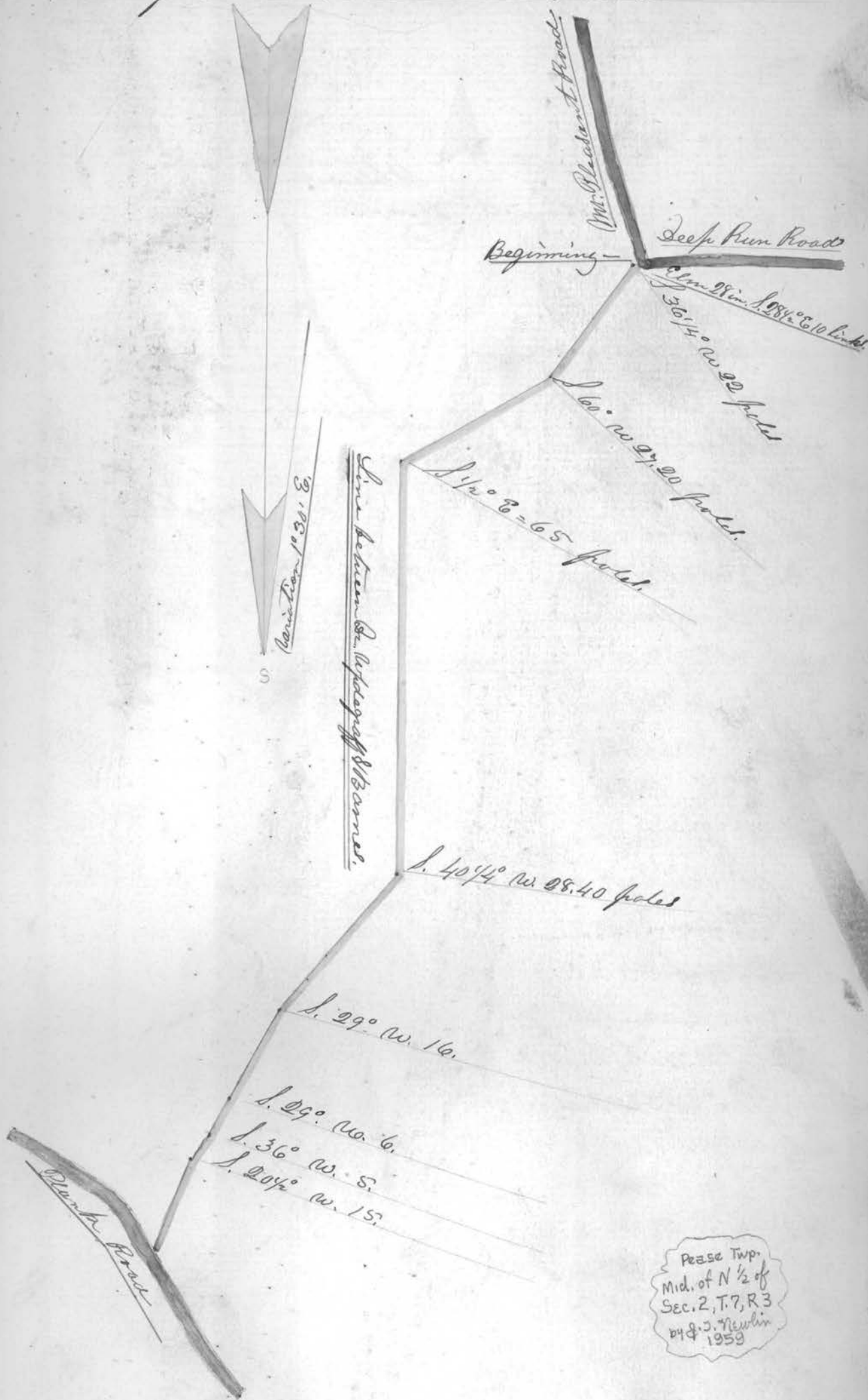
