




Issued by Sand (to Rogers A.D. 1867)








Road Plat

Plot of a road required by the Trustees of Smith Township Belmont Co. O. July 6th 1867. Beginning for the same on the land of Tom Williamson in the old road on the south side of the little Creek called the South fork of Little McMahons Creek in said Township. I took 10 rods and 11 1/2 links from a Buckeye 1 foot in diameter on the south bank of said Creek, bearing N 68° W at Station 1. Thence S. 60° E 8 rods and 20 links to Station 2. Thence S. 70° E 4 rods and 15 links to Station 3. Thence S 88° E 5 rods and 5 links to Station 4. Thence S. 70° E 5 rods and so to the old road on the N and S. boundary line between P. Gray and G. M. Robin.

South fork of Little McMahons Creek road





Plot of a road surveyed June 27th 1867 on the lands of Doctor S. H. Armstrong of Washington Spt. Belmont Co. O. Beginning for the same East of the mouth of Rockey fork R. R. S. C. from a Black Walnut tree 3 feet in diameter Bearing S. 50° W at Station 1 thence S 60° W 24 rods to Station 2, thence S 63° W 28 rods to station 3, thence S 59° W 28 rods & 22 links to Sta. 4, thence N 11° W 35 rods & 6 links to station 5, thence N 1° W 20 rods to station 6, thence N 17° E 7 rods to a red Elm tree 16 inches in diameter, And from to crop Captain Losenk to intersect the road down said Creek through Isaac Welsh's farm. And again commencing at the said Red Elm tree 16 inches diameter, thence N 17° E 25 rods to Sta. 7, thence N 23° E 26 rods 14 links to Sta. 8, thence N 19° E 16 rods to station 9, thence N 27° E 10 rods 11 links to Sta. 10, thence N 30° E 14 rods to Sta. 11, thence N 25° E 10 rods to Sta. 12, thence N 29° E 6 rods to Sta. 13, thence N 55° E 6 rods to Sta. 14, thence N 6° W 10 rods to Sta. 15, thence N 20° W 8 rods to Sta. 16, thence N 70° W 10 rods to Sta. 17, - thence N 19° W 10 rods to Sta. 18, thence N 14° W 10 rods to Sta. 19, - thence N 18° W 10 rods to Sta. 20, thence N 16° W 6 rods to Sta. 21, - thence N 74° W 4 rods to Sta. 22, thence N 18° W 12 rods to Sta. 23, - thence N 30° E 10 rods 14 links to Sta. 24, - thence N 16° W 10 rods to Sta. 25, thence N 20° W 10 rods to Sta. 26, thence N 79° W 6 rods to Sta. 27, - thence N 23° W 2 rods to Sta. 28, thence N 63° E 4 rods to Sta. 29, - thence N 60° E 7 rods to Sta. 30, thence N 57° E 7 rods 10 links to Sta. 31, - thence N 45° E 4 rods to a state in the road leading through Shepherd's farm.



Plat and survey of a County Road petitioned for by Ephraim Snyder and others, made under direction of the viewers of said road, dated December 2nd 1867. Praying for the establishment of a County road as follows. Beginning at a point on the Barnesville State road a few rods west of the Goshen and Smith Township line, thence N. E. to S. line, thence North on said line to the premises of C. Snyder N. E. to the premises of Joshua Poyor, thence N. W. to a Stake on said Poyor's premises, thence North on the line between the lands of Poyor & C. Snyder Jr. until it intersects a County road.

That they fix a, as the initial point of said road, a stake in the middle of the Barnesville State road, on the lands of Wm. G. Kerney, and fifteen feet west of the Township line, from which stake a Red oak sixteen inches in diameter bears S 32° E 2.72 poles. Running thence N 1° E 37.46 poles to a stake; thence N 20° E 7. poles to a Stake in Snyder's field; thence N 5 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 23. poles; thence N 69° E 24. poles; thence N 39° E 7.72 poles to a ravine; thence N 50° E 28.70 poles; thence N 36° W 14.65 poles to a stake in front of Snyder's house; thence N 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 62. poles to a Stake; thence N 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 7 poles to a tree; thence N 19° E. 6.34 poles; thence N 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 10. poles; thence N 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 18. poles to Poyor's line; thence N 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W. 30. poles to a stake, near a white oak; thence N 40° W. 16.54 poles to a Stake twelve feet west of Wilson's line; thence parallel to said line N 1° E 38. poles to a stake; thence N 36° E 2.66 poles to a stake on the lands of Poyor; twelve feet East of Wilson's line; thence N 1° E 74.72 poles to Stake in the middle of the Barnesville County road; and twelve feet East of the partition line between Wilson and Poyor, from which hickory ten inches in diameter bears S 55° E 2.48 poles.



line between the Township of Smith and Richland
crosses it, and between Section No 6 of the former, and Section
No. 4 of the latter. From said point, a White Oak, 32 inches in
diameter bears N 69° E 41 links; another White Oak 24 inches

Surveyed April 26th 1867, by Sane H. Ruggles and William Munn, David Brown and R. L. Riley, Clerks, John Miller and James K. Mitchell as Chain Carriers, and David Brown as a Marker, That they fixed as the initial point of said alteration, the bearing tree taken, being S. 3° E 4,18 poles, one boy, Elder 15 inches diameter to the centre of the Martinsville road leading to St. Albansville, And starting thence laid out said alterations and caused the same to be surveyed along the following described route: Thence N 57 1/2 ° W. 12.88 poles to a stake 6 feet north of a Wild Cherry tree; thence S 88 1/2 ° W 22.68 poles to a stake; thence N 67 ° W. 36. poles to a stake; thence N 87 1/2 ° W. 35.84 poles to a Sycamore 6 feet north of the stake; thence S 80 ° W 22.86 poles to a stake; thence West 42.26 poles to the section line between Judge Barton and Berry (and a witness tree taken to said corner. A Sycamore bearing S 70 1/2 ° W. 1.20 poles); thence S. 78 ° W. 28.80 poles to a stake, (a witness tree taken to said corner a Sycamore, bearing S 33 ° E 1.80 poles); thence N 87 ° W. 7.88 poles to a stake; thence N 41 1/2 ° W. 16.72 poles to a stake; thence N 66 ° W 22.24 poles to a stake; thence N 85 ° W 24.80 poles to a stake; thence N 61 1/2 ° W. 40. poles to a stake; thence N 49 1/2 ° W. 20.16 poles to a post and to a corner of a stone fence; thence N 65 ° W 24.08 poles to a stake; thence N 58 ° W. 15. poles to a stake; thence N 42 ° W. 23.24 poles to a stake; thence N 26 1/2 ° W 16 poles to a stake; thence N 44 1/2 ° E. 12.48 poles to a Sycamore tree; thence N 63 ° E 15.08 poles to a stake; thence N 26 1/2 ° E 6.48 poles to a stake; thence N 12 ° W 26.52 poles to a stake in line between the lands of Samus and Abner Stillwell; thence N 22 1/2 ° W. 15.88 poles to a stake; thence N 11 1/2 ° E 17.80 poles to a stake; thence N 20 ° W. 9.60 poles to a stake in lane leading to Paxton's house; thence N 32 ° W. 17.60 poles to a stake; thence N 38 1/2 ° W 17.28 poles to a stake; thence N 50 ° W. 10.92 poles to a stake; thence N 84 1/2 ° W. 21.94 poles to a stake; thence N 47 ° W. 19.38 poles to a stake; thence N 30 ° W. 13.80 poles to a stake in the centre of the road from Mount Pleasant to St. Albansville, And also the two witness trees taken for the termination of said road as follows, viz: A Sycamore bearing S. 5 ° E 3.60 poles 36 inches in diameter, And a Sugar tree bearing N 59 ° W 4.72 poles, 20 inches in diameter.
