You were appointed by the County Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, to view and lay out a proposed "alteration of a County Road", on the following route, as petitioned for by J. M. Mitchell et. al. as follows. An alteration of the County Road known as the St. Clairsville and McMahon's Creek Road, and the Road leading from Autt's Run to St. Clairsville, and to Scatterday's past Smith mill; beginning at the point where the Roads fork on the hill opposite Mitchell's Grove; thence with the dividing line between the land Dr. Mitchell, and the land belonging to the heirs of N. Cooper dec'd, to a stake about three rods West of Section line, and from said stake in an Easterly direction, about six rods to a stake in first mentioned Road, and from first mentioned stake by the most practicable route until it intersects the last of the above mentioned roads. To meet on the 18th day of September 1869.

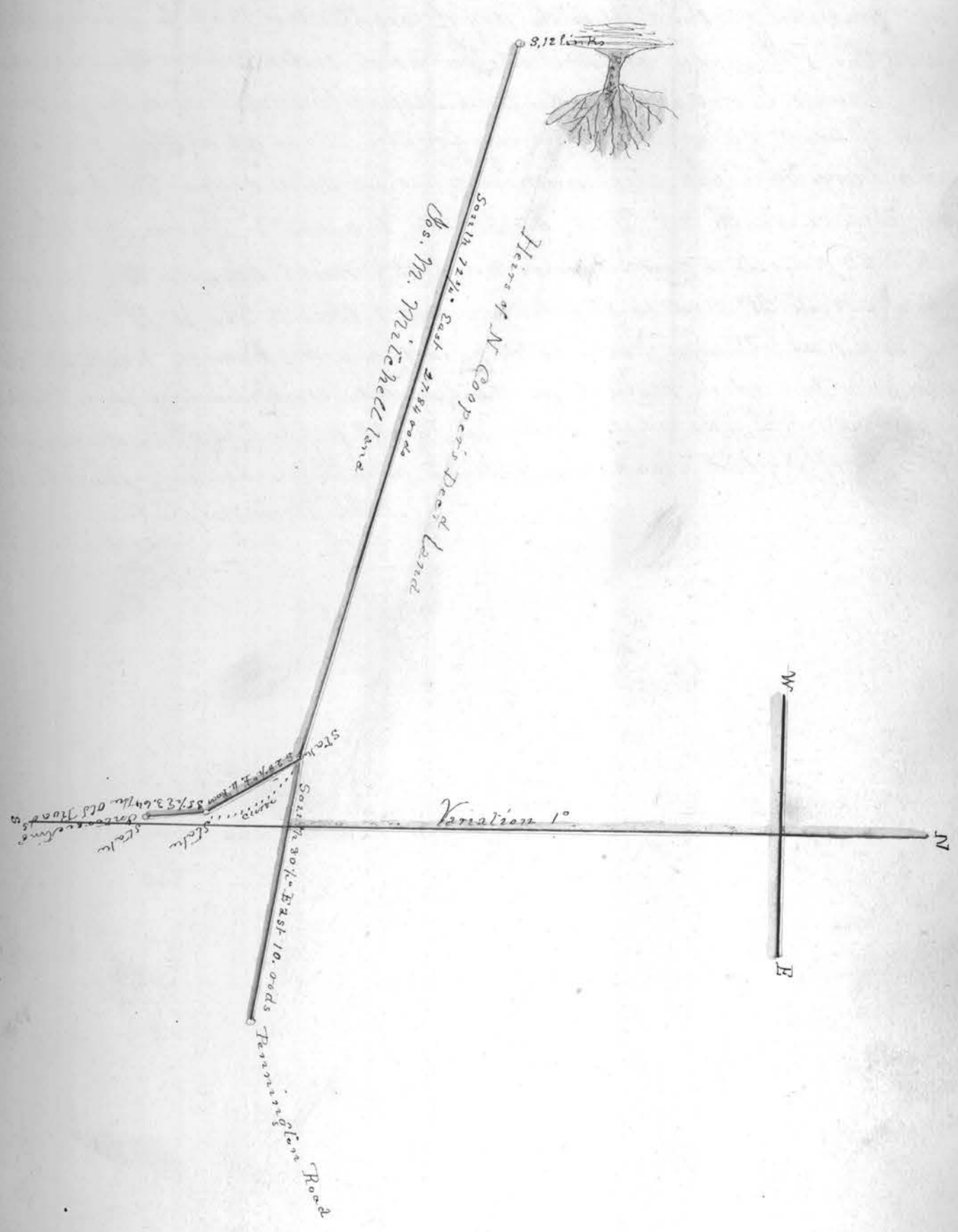
To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio.
The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated September 18th 1869, proceeded, on the premises on same day, to survey and mark the said alteration of said Road as described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submit the following return of said survey.

Surveyed Sept 18th 1869. The proposed route, as petitioned for by Dr. Jos. M. Mitchell et. al. as follows. Known as the St. Clairsville & McMahon's Creek road, as more fully appear in the above petition, and Field Notes.

Beginning for the same at the initial point where the roads fork on the hill opposite Dr. Mitchell's Grove at a stake, from which a Beech tree stands bears South 12 links to the initial point of said alteration; thence South $72\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East 27.84 rods, on the dividing line of Dr. Mitchell and Mr. Cooper's land to a stake, and 2.56 rods West of the section line running north and South; thence South $28\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East 4.00 rods to a stake with a radius sufficient to make the curve of said road; thence South $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East 3.64 rods intersecting the road leading the most South easterly direction; and thence South $80\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East 10.00 rods intersecting the road leading by Hiram Pennington's House, as it will more clearly appear in the Plat of said road, on the opposite page.
