The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated June 6<sup>th</sup> 1870, proceeded, on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the same month, to survey and mark the proposed County Road described in said order under the direction of the viewers therein named, and respectfully submit the following return of said survey; Beginning for the same on the lands of Francis McMillen at or adjoining the Village of Fairmount; thence  $N 11^{\circ} E$  9.88 ps and parallel with the East boundary of McMillen's addition to said 9.88 ps. to a Stake Station No 2; thence  $S 88^{\circ} E$  119.70 ps. to station No 3; thence  $N 2^{\circ} E$  30.40 ps. to station No 4; thence  $S 88 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  57.30 ps. to Station No 5; thence  $S 2^{\circ} W$  20 feet to station No 6; thence  $S 88 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  60.00 ps. to Station No 7; thence  $N 28 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  6.00 ps. to station No 8; thence  $S 84 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  10.15 ps. to station No 9; thence  $S 60 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  12.00 ps. to station No 10; thence  $S 88 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  85.92 ps. to station No 11; thence  $S 52^{\circ} E$  3.00 ps. to station No 12; thence  $S 38^{\circ} E$  11.00 ps to station No 13; thence  $S 60 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$  11.08 ps. to last station. 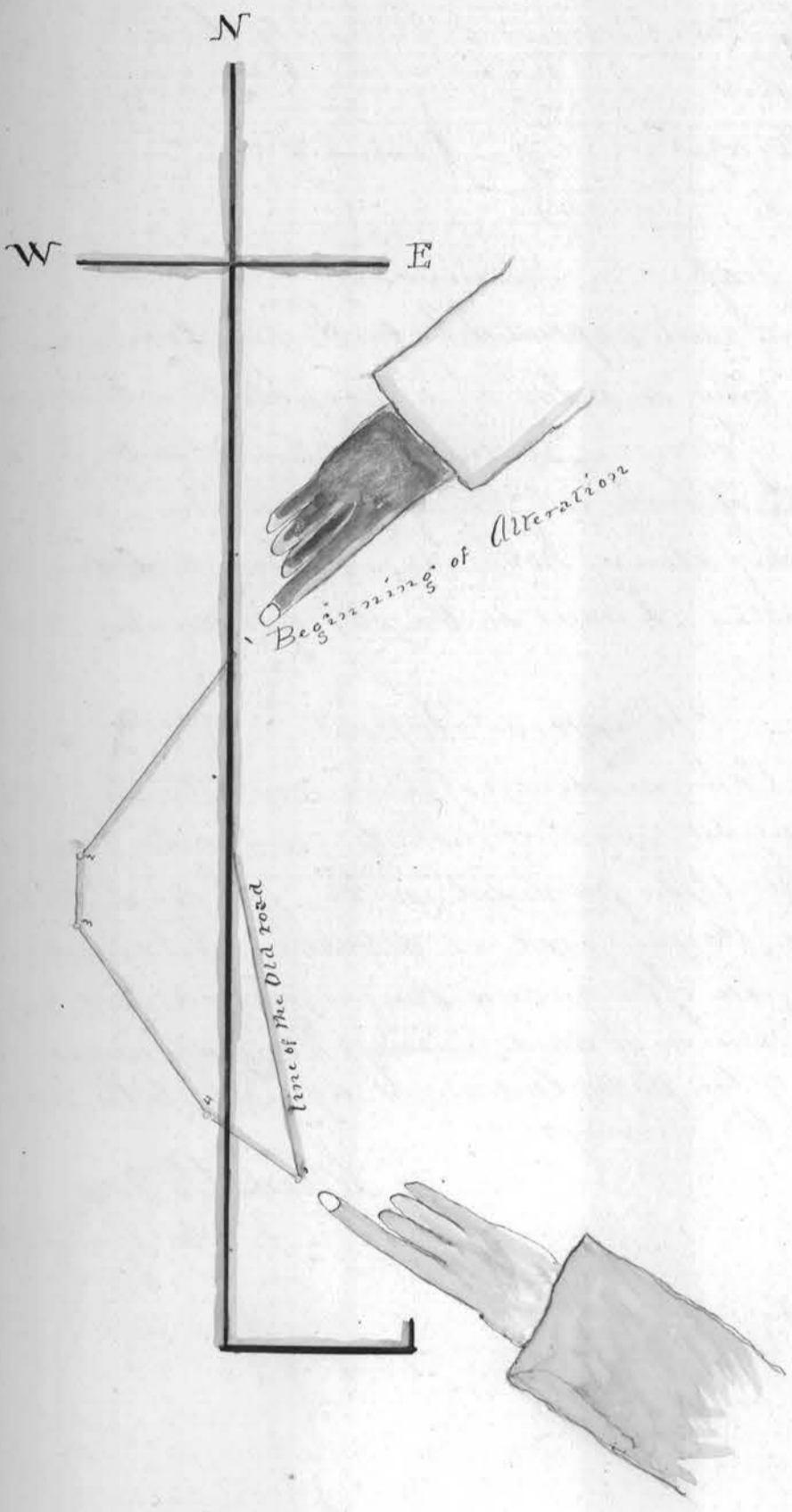

E. Corner of Nabb's Mill-house in a north-easterly direction at a stake in the Centre of the Old Road Station No. 1; thence S 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 15.32 poles to a stake; thence S 1° W. 3.90 poles to a stake; thence S 35° E 13.68 poles to a stake; thence S 56° E 6.54 poles to intersect said Old Road again. 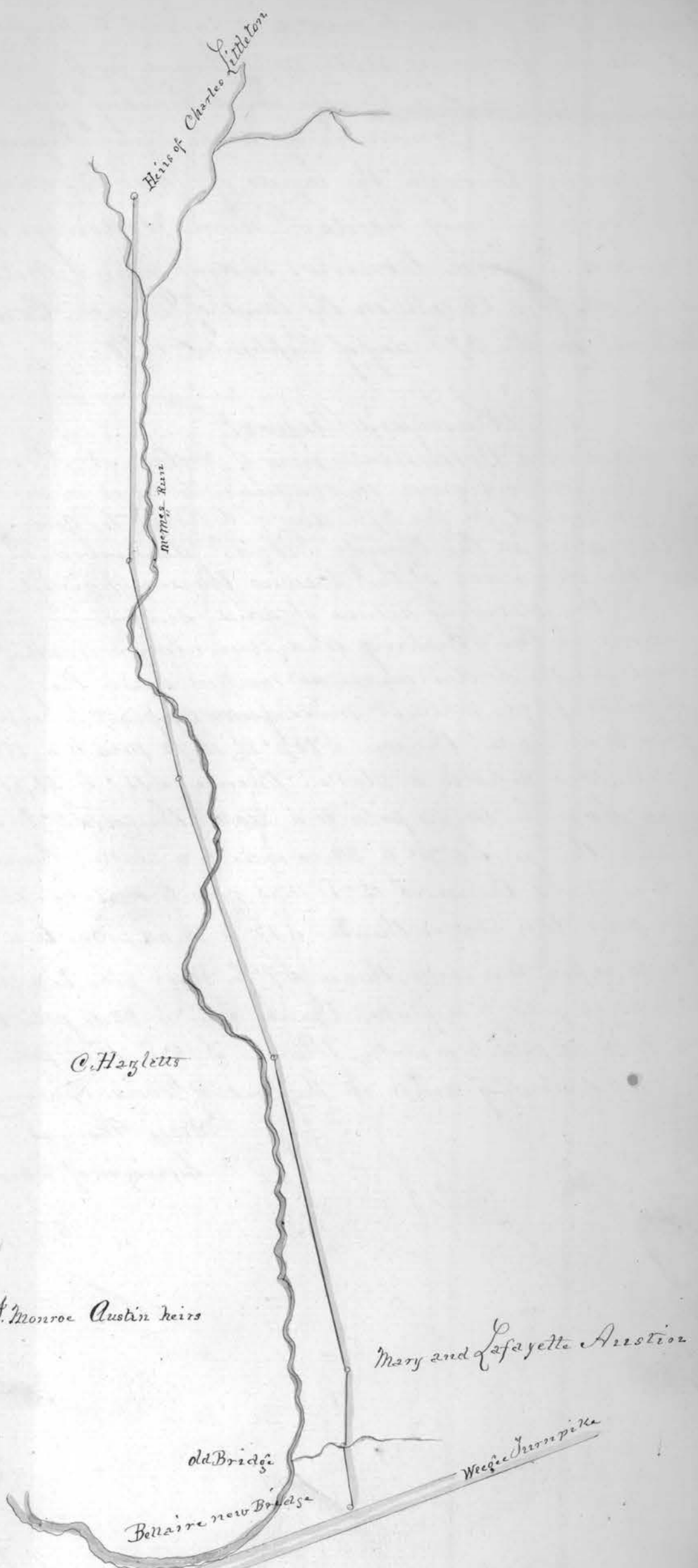

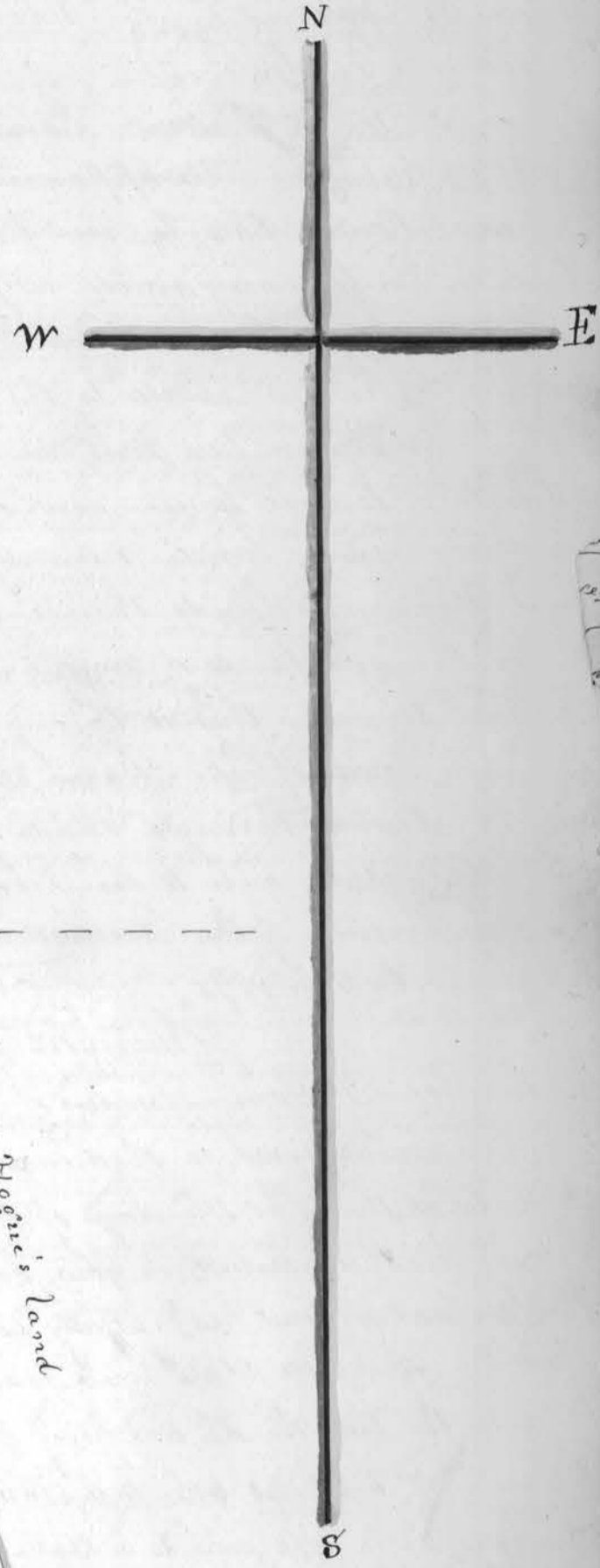
