

July Term to Nov Term 1804

July 2<sup>d</sup> 1804

Agreeable to adjournment the Commissioners viz Leom Okey John McWilliams and Robert Giffin met and proceeded to business as by law directed.

Ordered that a review of a road be made agreeable to the prayer of the petitioner William Woods and that Josiah Dillon Sterling Johnston esq. and Nally Hays be the persons to view said road and make a return thereof. an order was accordingly given. The viewers of the above road report to wit Leaving the old road at the line between townships nos. 6 & 7. and continue a south course with said line till it intersects the great road leading from the Ohio River to the town of St. Clairsville. so find it to be equal if not superior to the old road with the difference of first rod. Therefore the same is ordered opened.

Ordered that a review and survey of a road be made agreeable to a petition presented by Adam Johnston which is as follows. Beginning at John Winters mill and to go east said Johnston to intersect the road leading to Alex. Youngs saw mill to St. Clairsville the nearest and best way.

Adjourned until the second monday of August next

August 13<sup>d</sup> 1804

Agreeable to adjournment the Commissioners (met). Present Robert Giffin and John McWilliams and proceeded to business as the law directs. Before any business done Leom Okey came.

August 14<sup>d</sup> 1804

A return was made of the viewers and surveyor of a road from John Winters mill past the house of Adam Johnston to intersect the road from Alexander Youngs mill to St. Clairsville as followeth. That they arrived and caused the same to be surveyed being 3 miles. and 20 perches. the expense of viewing and surveying to be paid by the petitioners. An order was given for opening the same to be opened a necessary width. and not over 66 feet and in other respects convenient for the passage of travelers.

November 7<sup>d</sup> 1804

Ordered that a review and survey be made of a road beginning at the mouth of Captina creek thence down the Ohio River to the lower end of the County of Belmont.

Therefore James Henthorn son of John Benjamin McWay and Jacob Yoho are appointed to view the same the nearest and best way that the situation of ground will admit of and Matthew Gilmore is appointed to survey the same and make return of the same according to law to the Commissioners at their annual meeting on the second monday of June next.

Ordered that a review and survey be made of a road beginning at the mouth of Captina creek thence up said creek the nearest and best way that the situation of the ground will admit of until it intersects the road leading from John Sellers ferry to the salt works at or near the mouth of the Rocky fork of Captina creek. and Thomas Garrison are appointed to view. and Archibald Woods to survey the same. and make return of the same according to law at the annual meeting of the Commissioners. on the second Monday of June next.

Ordered that a review and survey be made of a road beginning at Robert Woods saw mill near the mouth of Glumus run. thence up said run. the nearest and best way. the situation of ground will admit of. until it intersects the road leading from Martins Ferry to Harris' mill. on Whaling Creek. at or near where. said road crosses the flat run. Therefore James Alexander junior. (Index shows William Tiffin to be principal petitioner - Auditor)

June 10<sup>th</sup> 1805

Ordered that a review and survey of a road be made by John Wilson. Robert Waddle. and William Vause. viewers. and John Israel surveyor. leaving the road from St. Clairsville to Zanesville. at or near Morristown. thence the nearest and best way towards White Eyes. Plains. on the Tuscarawas Branch. of the Muskingum. as far as to the line between Belmont and Muskingum. (General Index shows Newark Monroe to be principal petitioner - Auditor)

(Abney Chapman. principal petitioner is his index auditor)  
Ordered that a review and survey of a road be made by Thomas Wilson. John Israel. and William Vause. viewers. and Robert Johnston. surveyor. leading from St. Clairsville through the settlement on the head of Captua. Stillwater and Miles Creek. leaving the main road. at or near a lane. between Joseph Nichols house and Joseph Vaulaws. thence past Pleasantfield meeting house. Jacob Gregg's saw mill. and thence to intersect the road leading from Outley to Wills Creek.

Ordered that a review and survey of a road be made by Michael Moore. Isaac Moore and William Bates. viewers and Robert Johnston surveyor. beginning at the fork of Captua. thence up the north fork. past Jacob Moore and Isaac Bates to intersect the Pultney road. near Richard Coops. or William Hudgins.

Ordered that a review and survey of a road be made. from the south side of section no 28. in township no 7. in the 3<sup>rd</sup> range through sections nos. 27. 26 & 25. in said township. and section no 30. in the 6<sup>th</sup> township. and 3<sup>rd</sup> range to the mill

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of William Hough on Whaling Creek. thence the nearest and best route into the road from St. Clairsville to Daniel Harris' mill near John Rogers, and William Woods William Hulse, and Robert Thompson, are appointed to view, and Robert Johnston to survey the same, and make return according to law.

June 12<sup>th</sup> 1805

Return was made by the viewers of a road from the mouth of Coketown Creek, thence up said creek to intersect the road leading from John Sellers' ferry to the salt works, and made return that in their opinion, it will be of general & public utility, and the surveyor returned a plat of the same, which is 8 miles, 3 quarters, and 34 poles (long). The Commissioners order that the expense of the view and survey, be paid by the petitioners, and also order the supervisors through whose districts the same shall pass, to cause the same (to) be opened, a necessary width not exceeding 66 feet, and in other respects, convenient for the passage of trailers.

Ordered that a view and survey of a road be made from Caleb Eagles' mill the nearest and best way, that the ground will admit of past Olairfield meeting house, thence the nearest and best way into the Whaling road, leading from St. Clairsville to Zanesville, and Alexander Boggs, John Bogd, and Allen Stewart are appointed to view, and Robert Johnston to survey the same, and make return according to law. - order given - Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> 1805. The viewers of this road report (that it) is not of public advantage.

November 4<sup>th</sup> 1805

Ordered by the Commissioners that Joseph Dillon, William Vance, and Moses Moorehead, John Brown, and Daniel Bean be appointed viewers of the road leading from the road from St. Clairsville to Zanesville, leaving said road, at or near Morristown, thence the nearest and best way towards White Eyes Olair, on the Tuscarawas branch of the Muskingum, as far as the line between Belmont and Muskingum Counties, lately viewed and returned by John Wilson, Robert Naddle and William Gross, viewers, to which return, objections have been regularly filed. Robert Johnston is appointed surveyor. Said views to (be) made on the second Wednesday of April 1806. - order given.

Ordered by the Board of Commissioners, that Matthias Cray, Isaac Hill, and Valentine Shaffer, be appointed viewers, of a road from William Bills on Whaling Creek, to St. Clairsville, at or near Merchant Deford's. - order given. (Supra. Index shows William Giffen to be principal petitioner - auditor)

Ordered by the Commissioners, that David Geog, Benjamin Vail, Cornelius Boyau, be and are appointed viewers of a road to begin at St. Clairsville, from thence on the nearest and best ground to Caleb Eagles' mill, to cross the creek between said mill and Joshua Eagles saw mill, from thence through section No 6, on the shortest and best ground, to enter-

tions have been regularly made, and filed, said views  
to be made and returned against the first Monday of  
March.

Likewise a short road to begin on the County line where the Cadiz road intersects to intersect this above described road near Moses Marritts. said return being duly made in which it is stated by said viewers to be of public utility this return being twice read in open meeting and no objections being made thence to the Commissioners therefore records and is established said road allowing the County to pay the expense of viewing surveying chain carrying and marking.

Likewise there are orders issued by the Commissioners to the supervisors of roads whose districts said roads pass through to cause them to be opened as soon as possible a necessary width not exceeding fifty feet and made in other respects convenient for the passage of wagons and trailers.

It is ordered by the Commissioners that Alexander Young, John Berry and Jacob Mogg proceed on the third Monday of August to view

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a road beginning at the sixth mile tree on the road leading from Chillicothe west of Samuel Griggs thence through section 12 in the Township and Range and by the end of the road leading up Captain on section 9 Township 8 and range 6 from thence to the County line or or near the 33 section of Township 7 range.

To make return against the first Monday of September first ensuing Samuel Stark is appointed surveyor.

June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1807

Thomas Barley and John Murdy having made application for the alteration of a road leading up the little fork of Short Creek in their land. there are appointed James Alexander, John Mitchell, and Joseph Moore viewers to view said alteration as the law directs and make return thereof on the first Monday of September first ensuing - order given.

Sept 9<sup>th</sup> 1807

It is ordered by the Commissioners that Andrew Ryers, David Bush and Michael Carroll proceed on the last Monday of October to view a road beginning at Alexander Youngs saw mill and past David Bastons saw mill thence through sections no 14 and 15 down to the County line and due return make on the first Monday of December first ensuing. John Stewart is appointed surveyor.

It is ordered by the Commissioners that James Wilkins, William Vance and James McConnell proceed on the first Monday of October first ensuing to view a road beginning at the County line to intersect the road leading from St Clairs ville past Adam Johnston to the Crab apple and make return thereof on the first Monday of December first ensuing. John Stewart is appointed surveyor.

Sept 8<sup>th</sup> 1807

A return being made by Alexander Young and John Berry appointed viewers of the view of a road beginning on the road leading from Shuhling to Zanesville at or near the sixth mile tree running through section no 12 in the 7<sup>th</sup> Township and fifth range thence by the end of a road leading up Captain on section no 9, eighth Township and sixth range and from thence to the County line or or near 33 section of the 9<sup>th</sup> Township and seventh range said return being duly made in which it is stated by said viewers to be of public utility this return being twice read on two different days of the same meeting and no objections being made thereto the Commissioners therefore records and establishes said road to be a public highway allowing the County to pay the expense of viewing surveying chain carrying and marking.

Likewise there are orders issued by the Commissioners to the supervisors whose districts said road passes through to cause it to be opened as soon as possible a necessary width not to exceed fifty feet and made in other respects convenient for the passage of carriages and trailers.

James Alexander. and Joseph Moore who are appointed by the Commissioners to view an alteration that Thomas Parry and John Murphy applied for of the road up the little fork of Shoot Creek through their own land. said viewers having reported that said proposed alteration is on as good ground if not superior. and that the distance is but 11 poles longer. therefore Thomas Parry and John Murphy are permitted to make their road on said ground without.

It is ordered by the Commissioners that John Dickering Aaron Newhart and William Webb proceed on the fifteenth day of this next to view a road beginning at or near Charles Eckles house. from thence the nearest and best way to a suitable point or place on Dennis road. to make return therof on the first Monday of March first ensuing Joseph Satterthwait is appointed surveyor.

A return being made by David Rush. Andrew Byars. and Michael Carroll. appointed viewers. of the view of a road beginning at Alexander Youngs saw mill post David Rastous. Saw mill thence to the County line. said return being duly made in which it is stated by said viewers to be of public utility this return being twice read on two different days. of the same meeting. and no objections being made. thereto the Commissioners therefore records and establishes. said road to be a public highway allowing the petitioners to pay the expenses of viewing. Surveying. chain carrying and marking. likewise there are orders issued. by the Commissioners to the superintendents of the districts. said road passes through to cause it to be opened. a necessary width not exceeding fifty feet. and made in other respects. convenient for the passage of wagons and trailers.
