Your petitioners are of opinion that said road if opened will be expensive, useless, and burdensome to the County, and to witness being an worse ground and not so near to said town as the road now opened is.

We therefore pray that a review may be granted and said road and as in duty bound will pray.

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At a meeting of the Commissioners in June last. for road business. there was application for a road beginning at the termination of Wayne street. on the west side of St. Clairsville. thence through a lot of William Gamble. and land of Robert Thompson. there were at that time reviewors appointed. they have at this session made their report that it would be of public utility. to which then having been objections. and a remonstrance laid in. the the Commissioners proceeded and chose appointed Reed Boggs. John Orry. John Teggart. John Berry. and Hance Willey. as reviewors to meet at Michael Groves in St. Clairsville. on the first Monday of October next and proceed to review said road and make report to the Commissioners at their December meeting. whether said road will be of paved use. burdensome or inconveniencient. or otherwise. and to act in all respects as the law directs.

(The following entry dated December 4th 1811. appears of record. Vol 2. page 1. Auditor.)

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A return having been made by William McCay and William Boggs. on September last who were appointed reviewors of a road beginning at the termination of Wayne street. on the west side of St. Clairsville. thence through a lot of William Gamble's and land of Robert Thompson's to intersect the road from St. Clairsville to Vane's mill. in which it was stated by said reviewors to be of public utility. to which in September last a remonstrance was interred. and then the Commissioners appointed John Teggart. John Orry. Hance Willey. Reed Boggs. and John Berry as reviewors. said reviewors have at this time. made their return. in which they state. that said road will be of public utility. but allows the petitioners to pay for the ground

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on which the said road is laid out.

We the Commissioners will proceed to establish said road as soon as they the Commissioners are satisfied that the petitioners have complied with the viewers report.

(The following entry dated Dec. 4th 1811 appears of record. Vol. 2 - page 7 - Auditor)

Description of this above road. viewed and returned in September last to which a remonstrance was entered and five reviewers appointed to wit. John Taggart. John Perry. H. Davis. Willey Reed Boggs. and John Berry. a majority of which reported the road to be of public utility. allowing the applicants to pay for the ground.

The reviewers report was made at this meeting William Gamble finding himself agreed by said road running through his lot. applied to have persons appointed to assess damages.

The Commissioners have appointed Hugh McCoig. William McWilliams. Joseph Irwin. Alexander Young and William Rawage to meet on said lot. on the second Monday of January first ensuing. and proceed to assess damages and make report thereof on the first Monday of March next March 3rd / 1812. The assessment of damages for the above is 65 dollars.

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(The following entry dated Sept 3rd 1811 appears of record. Vol. 2 page 2 - Auditor) (Indeed name of James Barnes - auditor)

It is ordered by the Commissioners that Samuel Gregg. Abram Gregg and John Smith. who are appointed viewers to view alterations petitioned for at this meeting of a road from Barnesville to St. Clairsville beginning at David Fawcett's thence towards St. Clairsville so as to cross McMahons creek between Jacobs and Levi Pfeifers. grist and saw mills. and thence the most and best way to intersect the road leading from St. Clairsville to Zanesville on Samuel Morris's land. to meet at David Fawcett's on the second Monday of October first ensuing. and proceed to view said proposed alterations as the law directs. and make report to the Commissioners on the first Monday of December first ensuing.

Jefftha Sharp is appointed surgeon.

To meet at George Mucks on the first Tuesday of April first ensuing and proceed to view said proposed road, as the law directs, and make return thereof on the first Monday of June first ensuing. Jetha Stark is appointed Surveyor.
