Your petitioners pray that your honos appoint three disinterested men to view said road. and your petitioners will ever pray.

Dec. 7th 1812 = It is ordered by the Commissioners that John Boyd esq. Alexander Harrow and James Alexander Lyons who are appointed as surveyors to view the Wheling road from Elijah Woods to St. Clairsville, as it is represented that there can be a nearer and better way than the present way. You are to meet at Elijah Woods on the third Monday of February first ensuing and proceed on said road as the law directs and make return thereof on the first Monday of March first ensuing.

John Stewart is appointed surveyor.

March 2nd 1813 = Petition having been made by James Alexander John Boyd and Alexander Harrow who were appointed surveyors to view the alteration applied for on the road from Elijah Woods to St. Clairsville.

Said petition having been duly made in which it is stated by said petitioners that the alteration that they have proposed to be of public utility but objections having been regularly made against said alteration to wit from John Nichols to where it intersects the road again. the Commissioners however as the law directs proceeded and appointed David Moore John Willey esq. Thomas Major Thomas Evans and David Berry to meet at William Sharpless on the 1st of this instant and proceed faithfully and impartially to view said alteration and report to the Commissioners on the first Monday of June next whether said alteration if opened and kept in repair by the publice will be (a) useless inconvenient and burdensome or otherwise.

June 7th 1813 = At the Commissioners last meeting for road business they appointed David Moore John Willey esq. Thomas Majors Thomas Evans and David Berry as surveyors to view alteration made on the Wheling road between St. Clairsville and the River Ohio particularly where the alteration took place between John Nichols and where it intersects the road again which was objected against by William Sharpless O. Hammond and others. Said surveyors have viewed said alteration and made their return at this meeting wherein they state that to change the present or old road of the road would be burdensome to the publice and inconvenient to travelers.
