August 16th 1816. The following remonstrance was presented to the Commissioners of Belmont County.

Whereas a petition has been presented to your Board praying that a certain public road. laid out from John Mc Malone's to Giltions mill. in Richland township may be vacated. for the reasons that said road is not of public utility. that it cannot be made so that a wagon can pass along it and that it will be a burden on the inhabitants of the supervisors districts through which it passes.

If the subscribers object to the vacation of said road
 1st Because the said road is laid upon ground where a very good wagon road can be made without any extraordinary labor difficult.

2nd Because the said road is of public utility because it is necessary for the accommodation of the neighborhood.
