The Commissioners not being satisfied to establish the above road until they are satisfied of the establishment of a road to extend through Monroe County which is said to be in contemplation do suspend any further decision until satisfactory proof is made of said establishment.

The Commissioners of Belmont County received a certificate from the Commissioners of Monroe County that there had lately been established according to law a road to extend through said County of Monroe from the end of the aforesaid in Belmont County.

Therefore the Commissioners ordered said road to be recorded a public highway.

Order given to Moses Milligan who entered into bond together with Daniel Conner as security in the sum of fifty dollars. conditioned as the law directs.

(The following is undated March 10th, 1819 appears of record vol. 2 page 78-Auditor)

The Commissioners being satisfied that the petitioners had given the notice as required by law proceeded to appoint Isaac Branson Evan Jenkins and John Mercer respectable land owners of said County to view said proposed road and make return thereof of their proceedings on the first Monday of June next they are to meet at a school house near James Murphys on the second Monday in May next. Jephtha Sharp is appointed surveyor.

Order given to Moses Milligan who entered into bond together with Daniel Conner security in the sum of fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs.

The viewers returned the following report to wit.

According to your order we proceeded to view a road from the road near James Murphys thence by Moses Milligan's, Anthony Arnold's and near William Groves mill to intersect the Belmoat road and so on to Belmoat town near Nicholas Gasaway's and after taking into consideration the advantages we consider the road to be of general ^{and} public utility by giving a passage from Borawill and to Moosefield and Freeport and furnish Pierces salt works and postoffice to the citizens of that neighborhood.

The Commissioners caused said return to be twice read on two different days of the same meeting and on the second reading John McCullough presented a petition praying damages that he would sustain in consequence of the establishment of said road whereupon the Commissioners appointed Thomas Gilham Thomas McWilliam Alexander Harrow William Dunn and John McWilliams good and lawful men of said county to assess the damage or several damages that said petitioners may sustain with orders to re-examine the ground through said objectors land if in their opinion the nature of the road required it they are to meet on the fourth on Thursday the 19th inst and proceed to assess the damage if any and make their report to the Commissioners at the next August Court of Common Pleas to be held for the County Order given for the same

The viewers aforesaid who were appointed on the 5th of June last to assess the damage aforesaid made the return of said assessment to wit.

Cap 98-D and William Dunn who were appointed on the 5th of June last to assess the damages petitioned for by John McCullough of Ohio County Commonwealth of Virginia made their return of the assessment of damages aforesaid assessed by them in which they have stated the said John McCullough is intitled to four hundred dollars damages.

Therefore the Commissioners being satisfied the establishment of said road would be burdensome to the County the Commissioners therefore believe the prayer of the petitioners ought not to be granted.

Moses Milligan having notice of appeal from said judgment to the Court of Common Pleas and entered into bond and security as the law directs.

Vol 2 Jacob Davis as guardian for James Dixon has applied for alteration in the land of James Dixon of the road laid out leading from

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Charles Eckles mill. to opposite George Hulls. or nearly so. the alteration of said road to begin. where it crosses the little fork of McMahan's creek. so as to lead down the said little fork on the north east side. thereof to intersect the road leading up the main Creek. at the mouth of said little fork.

Matthew Howell. Oliver Demfield and James Hatchison. are appointed viewers. and to meet. at the Widow. Dickson's. on the 27th day of this month. and proceed to the view of said alteration and to make return thereof at the next Court of Common Pleas.

(Also the following order dated March 10th 1817. appears of record vol. 2. page 76-Auditor)

Page 76.* The report of the above viewers. was this day returned wherein it is stated. that the present established road. is two hundred and eighteen yards. The proposed alteration is eight hundred and seventy seven yards. but they were of the opinion. that if the new rout. was established. it would be of no inconvenienc as it would be on better ground. and easier kept up.

But the Commissioners considering the difference. on the distance to be injurious. to the publick. do adjudge the prayer. of the petitioners. to be unreasonable and ought not to be granted.

Page 78* Robert Moore presented a petition praying for the alteration of the road from Nicholas Gossawags. on the Whaling road to the town of Belvoir. in the words following to wit.

Gentlemen. We your petitioners conceive that there is an alter-
ation might be made. on the road that leads from the Whal-
ing road at Nicholas Gossawags. to the town of Belvoir. viz.
from James E. Howell. saw mill to the Whaling road. if instead
of intersecting at Nicholas Gossawags. to intersect on the top
of the hill east of said Gossawags where there is a Baptist
meeting house is going to (be) raised. it would likewise be a nearer
way to intersecting the Newcooperstown road. and not eat through
small tracts. of land as it now does.

There is likewise a road opened the way mentioned.

We therefore pray. that you in your wisdom would appoint
viewers. to review that part of the road viz. from James E.
Howell saw mill to the whaling road. and we your petition-
ers will ever pray.
