The petition of a number of the citizens of the County aforesaid shew that they labor under many disadvantages, for the want of a good road from St. Clairsville to Woodsfield in the County of Monroe. Your petitioners further state that there was a road laid out, some years ago, but was laid on such bad ground, that it has never been entirely opened, and if opened, could not be traveled.

Your petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable Body will grant a writ of said road, beginning at Walla Craig's block Smith shop, in Belmont County, and ending at the line between the Counties of Belmont and Monroe, on the direction of Woodsfield. Your petitioners further state that the distance on said road can be shortened, and the road laid on much better ground than the present rout.

Your petitioners therefore pray that you will appoint men to view said road, and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.
