S 68 E 12 perches. S 37 N 18 perches. S 62 N 60 perches. S 18 N 70 perches containing 985 perches, which is 3 miles and 25 poles.

Vol 3 (The following entry dated June 1821. appears. of record vol. Page 3 page 22 - And lot.)

Thomas Eldridge surveyor made his return of the survey of the road from Joseph Biggs mill on Ogle Creek to Benjamin Kinsley's mill on the road from Springfield to Benjamin Kinsley's. The owners made no return.

David Lockwood presented the following return of the road affidavit for last March Court. from McMahons creek past John Cunningham saw mill through the lands of Benjamin Workman thence to the road leading from St. Clairsville to Striggs mill to the land of Matthew Scotts &c. and the survey also returned.

Vol 3 The return of the owners was this day made in open meeting which was for the road from McMahons creek up Brooks run past John Cunningham saw mill to Matthew Scotts. and no objections were made. the Commissioners ordered said road recorded a public highway and so ordered the width to be thirty feet.

Vol A Henry McMurray presented the following petition to wit.
Page 333 To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Belmont County O. The petition of the undersigned humbly sheweth that it would be very useful to the public utility in Mead Township to have a public road laid out and opened in said township beginning at Joseph Biggs mill on Ogle Creek. thence up the hill through lands belonging to Samuel and Thomas Coleman. James Williams and John Daily. and Benjamin Kinsley. to intersect with the road leading from Dillies Bottom. to St. Clairsville. at Benjamin Kinsley's.

We therefore pray for a view of said road and if consistent with public utility to have an order for same as soon as convenient.
