Henry McMurray presented a petition praying for a road to be established beginning at Joseph Biggs mill on Oke Creek thence through the lands of Samuel Coleman and Thomas Coleman. James Williams. and John Dailey. and Benjamin Kinsey to intersect the road from Dillies Bottom to St. Clairsville. at B. Kinseys.

Whereupon the Commissioners caused said petition to be read in open meeting and being satisfied the road was advertised. and the said Henry entered into and acknowledged a bond for the payment of costs. in the sum of sixty dollars with Zachariah Hays as security. conditioned as the law directs.

They proceeded and afforidt. George Roush. Vachel Hall and Jeremiah Hays. land holders of said County. as viewers and Thomas Eldridge as surveyor to meet the last Friday in April next. and make return the first Monday of June next.

June 5th The viewers made the following return to wit. on the back of the order issued to them.

June Session 1821.

Alexander McNaugay one of the road Commissioners appointed by joint resolution of both houses of the last General Assembly to lay out a road from the town of Sciotosville in the County of Belmont. to the town of Cadiz in the County of Harrison. made a return of their proceedings in the words following to wit.

We the undersigned road Commissioners appointed by an act of the General Assembly of the State of Ohio. to lay out mark and establish a state road from the town of Sciotosville in the County of Belmont to the town of Cadiz in the County of Harrison. having been first duly sworn as the law directs. proceeded to survey and mark said road agreeable to said act.

Beginning at St. Clairsville. thence by the way of Alexander McNaugay's mill on Wheling Creek. thence near Alexander Hammonds fulling mill on Short Creek to intersect the state road leading from Wheling town. to Cadiz at a school house known by the name of Glazemus school house. thence to the town of Cadiz.

We therefore pray your Honorable Board. to issue an order for the opening of said road sixty feet wide. and put it in complete order for passengers and carriages of every kind.

Given under our hands this first day of June. one thousand eight hundred and twenty one.

Vol. 3 Rice Boggs return of the road made by the various from Eno's Matsons this day caused said return to be audibly read in open meeting on the second day and no objections were made thereto. the Commissioners ordered said road to be recorded a mean and width not exceeding thirty feet a public highway. Plat of said road also was returned.

Vol. A. George Sharp presented the following petition to wit

Your petitioners being inhabitants of Wheling township labor under many inconveniences for the want of a public road they therefore pray that a road may be granted and laid out according to law beginning at the west end of John L. Youngs lane. from thence the nearest and best way to the Orsby town Crabapple meeting house. thence the nearest and best way to Thos Sharps mill on the head waters of Wheling creek.

Your petitioners ful themselves humbly confident that a road leading along the above mentioned places would greatly accommodate the adjacent settlements and conduce greatly to the public utility as there is no convenient way by which a wagon or any other carriage can get to Thomas Shanks mill.
