Beginning at or near William H. Maltous, in Smith township, and running thence by William Mc Gaughys and William Workman so as to intersect the Barnesville road near Amos Maltous.

Your petitioners therefore pray that your Honors would appoint suitable characters to view the ground, as aforesaid and make report to you according to law, and your petitioners as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
