The petition being audibly read, and the Commissioners being satisfied the notice was given that the law directed, and the said Eunice Bailey entered into and acknowledged a bond, and Samuel Shorles as his security, in the sum of sixty dollars, conditioned as the law directs.

Whereupon they appointed Henry Sidwell, Thomas Berry and George Atkinson Esq. as viewers to meet the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of this instant at Owen Davies, and proceed to the duties of their appointment, and make return to the Commissioners, on the first Monday of December next. The petition of the subscriber respectfully sheweth that a public road designated to lead from the Wheling to the Mount Pleasant road, near Baileys mill has been lately laid out through my land, as I conceive greatly to the injury thereof, there being already one public road through said land, and the present one crossing the cleared part of said land so much, sooner will as to do it (almost) the most public injury, that a road passing through it could do.

I request therefore that the Commissioners would be pleased to appoint such number of disinterested men, as the law in like case directs to adjudge the damages sustained by your petitioner, in consequence of such road passing thus through his land.

which was a damage of \$50000 should the road be-

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Established on the present road. They therefore ordered the same men to proceed a second time to meet the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of this instant and make return against the first Monday of June next.

June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1823. The viewers made the following report to wit. We the subscribers who were appointed to assess the damages sustained by Jonathan Taylor in consequence of a road being laid out through his farm. Having met the second time agreeable to direction proceeded to view said road. and taking into view the value of said farm we united in judgment that the value thereof will be lessened to the amount of five hundred dollars. if established agreeable to the return of the first viewers. as stated in our first report which we now agree to confirm except that we are willing that the ten dollars damages mentioned in case it want the second route may be taken off.

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David Harst and Josiah Bundy made their report on the petition of Jonathan Taylor. made the following report to wit  
 All the subscribers who were appointed by the Commissioners of Belmont County on the petition of Jonathan Taylor for damages occasioned to his farm in consequence of a road being laid out through the same. Commencing in the Mount Pleasant road. near Cunnor Bailey's mill leading to Wheling after being duly qualified proceeded to view the premises. and agree to report our judgment that if said road should be established. agreeable to the survey of the former viewers said farm will be injured. five hundred dollars inasmuch as there are two roads already through said land. we also agreeably to our orders viewed another road. and give it as our opinion. that by lengthening the road about forty thousand poles. it can be taken on better ground. and lessen the damage down to ten dollars which we think will be due to said Taylor if the road should be established on the new proposed route. There is a road laid already. on the whole of the new route. from A to B. on the annexed plat which is about seventy poles.
