

### ROAD PETITION

For the Change and Relocation of a Road in Pease Township,  
 Improvement No. 86 Petitioned for by I. N. Raymer and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Change and Relocation of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: *Beginning* in what is known as the Deep Run Road in Pease Township, Belmont County, Ohio, Near the corner of Ben Bess one acre lot; thence northerly through the land of W. B. Francis and May Keher; thence running northerly to a point northerly of the house owned by Roy Finney; thence following in the same course of said Lot to the line of lands of I. N. Ramer, May Kehrer and W. b. Francis; thence continuing north westerly and following the general course fo said Road and about sixty feet therefrom to another four acre tract belonging to W. B. Francis and May Kehrer; thence continuing into said land and through the lands of Mrs. Mary Ramer to the lands of Lydia Paulman; thence along he edge of her land to the north-easterlyland of Alice Hosen field and again entering into said Deep Run Road.

Your petitioners pray that said road may be established 40 feet wide and that the road between points where the same is changed may be vacated.

Pursuant to your order dated 19, I make my report to you as follows, in the matter of the of the public road petitioned for by and others.

1. My opinion is the granting of the improvement; but with the following changes, which in my judgment should be made, to-wit:
