

ROAD PETITION

For the Establishing and Building of a Road in Washington Township,
 Improvement No. 90 Petitioned for by T. W. Brown and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Establishing and Building *of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning* at the top of Federal Hill where T. W. Brown road enters the Public Road, thence in an easterly direction through the lands of T. W. Brown and Lone A Brown, thence through the lands of O. C. Williamson and Sarah A. Williamson, thence in an easterly direction through the lands of L. D. Moore and Julia A. Moore, crossing Piney Creek near the mouth of it. Thence in an easterly direction through the lands of Crawford Perkins, (south of present road if a grade can be gotten), entering the Public Road near the residence of Crawford Perkins. Damages and costs to be paid by the County. Location in Washington Township Belmont County, Ohio.

The Commissioners shall order a portion of the compensation and damages to be paid by the petitioners, and the petitioners fail to pay same by the time fixed by the Commissioners: Then in either such case the said applicants will pay into the treasury of said County the COSTS AND EXPENSES incurred in the proceedings of said improvement.

Brown and others, have filed a petition in the office of the Commissioners of the County, on the 29th day of September 1919, for the Establishing and Building of a public road, along the following route, to-wit: Beginning

the same was this day considered by the Commissioners, and it appearing that said petition is regular and in conformity to law, and that the said T. W. Brown has filed herein a bond as required by law. It is ordered that the 21st day of October 1919, at 10 o'clock A. M., be fixed as a date to view the same, at which date they will meet at Commencing Point and go over the route of said proposed road.

They also fixed the 10th day of November 1919, at 10 o'clock A. M., as the date for final hearing at the office of the County Commissioners at which time it will be considered whether said improvement will be granted, and if granted, a time fixed for hearing claims for compensation and damages.

It is further ordered, that notice of the time and place of both such view and hearing be given by publication once a week for three consecutive weeks in the The Bellaire Independent a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the County of Belmont.

Brown and others, in the The Bellaire Independent, a newspaper of general circulation in said county required by law, and the former orders of this Board, the Commissioners on this 21st day of October 1919, met at the time and place in said notice designated and did view the route of said proposed road improvement, and considering such improvement to be of sufficient public importance, it is ordered that the County Surveyor make a plat and survey of the same and report to the Board in writing on or before the Survey not ordered day of 19, the time set for the hearing, and shall set forth in said report his opinion either for or against the granting of such proposed improvement, accompanied with a statement of the estimated compensation and damages due each person, firm or corporation whose land is to be taken if the proposed improvement is established. Such report shall also state the width of said improvement, which shall not be less than thirty feet nor more than sixty feet, and also recommend any changes in the improvement, which in his judgment, should be made.
