

ROAD PETITION

For the Re-location, alteration, and establishment of a Road in Washington Township, Improvement No. 92 Petitioned for by Osman Caldwell and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Relocation, alteration establishment of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning at or near the intersection of the brick road and Crabapple Road at Alledonia, Ohio; thence through the lands of the following persons and others up Crabapple Creek to-wit;- A. B. Caldwell, Ross J. Alexander heirs, Thomas Atkenson, atkensonPerkins, James Sanders heirs, William Roberts, A. R. And Allice Caldwell, Osman Caldwell Joseph Davidson, Lizzie Barkes, Dwitt Danford, Hitchcock & Reese, J. E. Timberlake, Martha Crooks and Thomas Wright, thence by the road leading up to the left fork of Crabapple Creek through the lands ow Winfield Moore, Matilda Phillips, Joshua Phillips, heirs, Henry Baker and Ithamer Phillips at or near where the present road intersects the Monroe County, line; and also by the right fork of Crabapple Creek from the lands of Thomas Wright through the lands of Roass and Lenora Taylor, Zach Taylor, Jesse Taylor, Otha Martin, James Phillips and Alonza Phillips, heirs and through the lands of Emmett Moore and Dink Pugh, if necessary, to at or near where the present road intersects the Monroe Countyline; also across the lines and right of way of the Pennsylvania Company, O.
