

ROAD PETITION

For the Vacation of a Road in Wheeling Township, Improvement No. 102 Petitioned for by The Uniontown Coal Company and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Vacation of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning at the northerly end of bridge on the Uniontown and New Athens Road; thence in as north-westerly direction through the lands formerly owned by W. A. Sharp and W. T. Caldwell to the intersection of the range line; thence following the range line North between the lands formerly owned by W. T. Caldwell John D. Hays and Fred Zayer, all of said lands being now owned by The Industrial Coal and Coke Company; and also through the land of Sherman Dunlap and William Harris to the road running East and West, past what is known as Crab Apple Church; said road being situated in Wheeling Township, Belmont County, Ohio.
