

ROAD PETITION

For the Establishment of a Road in Wayne Township, Improvement No. 111 Petitioned for by Isaiah Phillips and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Establishment of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning same at Washington and Wayne Township line near residence of James Phillips; thence in a southwesterly direction through lands of James Phillips to land land of Frank Shepherd; thence e in same direction through said lands to old road; thence west along line of old road to land of Isaiah Phillips; thence through said land to land of L. M. Perkins; thence through said land, terminating at or near L. M. Perkins' sheep house at junction of Belmont Ridge and Piny Road.
