

ROAD PETITION

For the Alteration of a Road in Smith Township,
Improvement No. 124 Petitioned for by James Warnock and Others.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the alteration of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning for the same at a point in said road near a culvert and on the lands of Elizabeth E. Fulton thence through said lands westerly along the creek bank to and across a small run on the lands of Stephen and Mary Ronyak; thence through said lands to the lands of Rosa Fador; thence through said lands to and across the right of way of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company to the lands of James and Viola Warnock; thence through said lands to and across McMahon's Creek to the said road; thence west along said road to a stake near the residence of James Warnock; thence westerly to and through the lands of Rosa Fador to the lands of J. M. and S. B. Warnock; thence westerly through said lands near a beech thereon the land of Robert Coen; thence through said lands to a stake in the Jacobsburg and Warnock Road; thence north on said road to the intersection of said Glencoe and Warnock Road.

AND EXPENSES incurred in the proceedings of said improvement.
