E. Slevin to a gap on the line between the N. E. Slevin farm and the Charles Jefferis farm, thence following the line fence for about one hundred fifty yards taking about a ten foot strip from the Jefferis land, then follow the old outlet to the Township Road to the farm of Peter Butler, thence following the Township Road through the farms of Peter Butler, A. J. Burkhart and Geo. Gallagher to State Road #379..

the same was this day considered by the Commissioners, and it appearing that said petition is regular and in conformity to law, and that the said John Pekarie has filed herein a bond as required by law. It is ordered that the 9th day of September 1936, at 10.00 o'clock A.M., be fixed as a date to view the same, at which date they will meet at the commencing point and go over the route of said proposed road.

They also fixed the 14th day of September 1936, at 10.00 o'clock A.M., as the date for final hearing at the office of the County Commissioners at which time it will be considered whether said improvement will be granted, and if granted, a time fixed for hearing claims for compensation and damages.

It is further ordered, that notice of the time and place of both such view and hearing be given by publication once a week for three consecutive weeks in the Daily Times a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the County of Belmont.

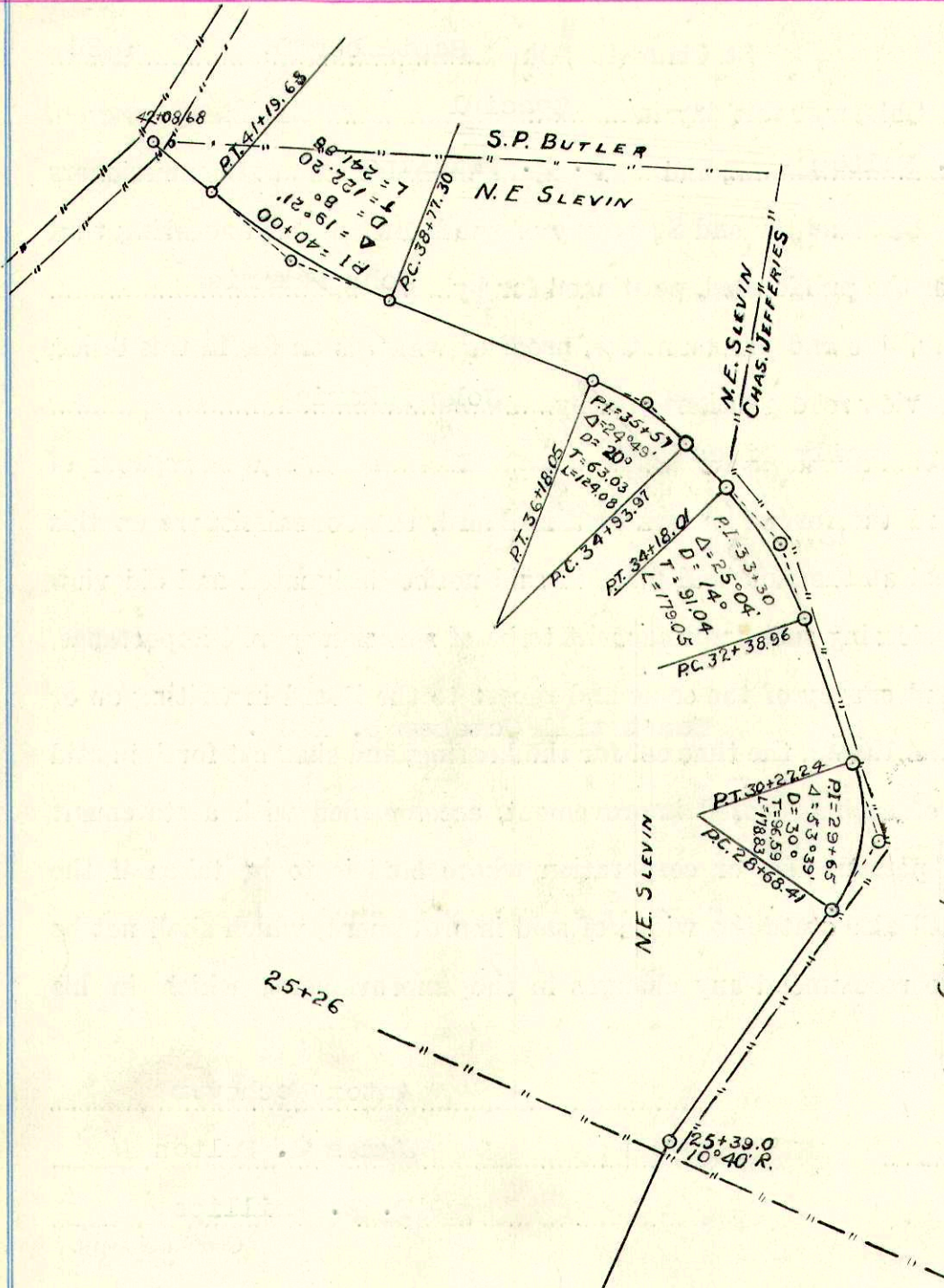
This road furnishes a cut of between the S. H. #701 and the Boston Road which is a County Highway. This is a desirable road.

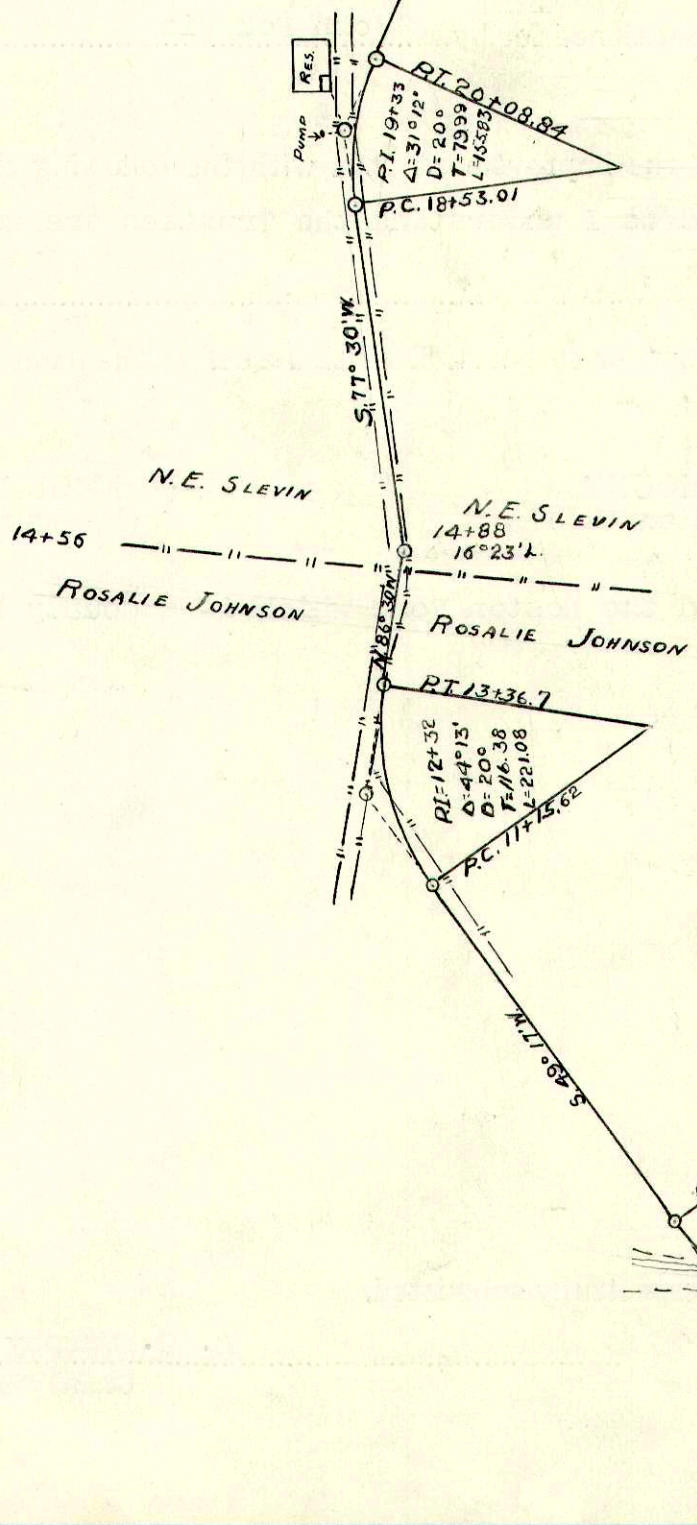
