

ROAD PETITION

For the establishment of a Road in Goshen Township,
 Improvement No. 388 Petitioned for by Allan Kemp and Others
 TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improve-
 ment hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the establishment
of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described and pray that you will institute and

order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning
 At the junction of Bend Fork Creek and Rush Run in Goshen Township, Belmont County, State of Ohio,
 Thence west, through the land of Nancy J. Hatcher up the point to a natural bench or level, on
 the south side of the ridge, then following the general course of said bench or level through the
 land of Byron P. Kemp's estate, and G. W. and Emma Price, thence at the base of a hill and north
 of a barn and the run on the land of Peter Jr. and Almeda T. Kemp and Dennis and Laura Kemp to
 rejoin the present road which joins the Bethesda-Hunter County Road at Mabel Wharton's. The
 total length of proposed change being approximately 200 rods.

There is no compensation or damages asked for land taken except that the proper officials are
 required to provide some fence and to pay for any trees that may be removed.

It is ordered that the 14th day of September 19 37, at 10.00 o'clock A.M., be fixed as a date to view the same, at which date they will meet at the commencing point and go over the route of said proposed road.

They also fixed the 27th day of September 19 37 at 2.00 o'clock P.M., as the date for final hearing at the office of the County Commissioners at which time it will be considered whether said improvement will be granted, and if granted, a time fixed for hearing claims for compensation and damages.

It is further ordered, that notice of the time and place of both such view and hearing be given by publication once a week for three consecutive weeks in the Bellaire Democrat a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the County of Belmont.

SURVEYOR'S REPORT ON ROAD

St. Clairsville, Ohio, October 16, 1937

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

Pursuant to your order dated September 14, 1937, I make my report to you as follows, in the matter of the establishment of the public road petitioned for by Allan Kemp and others.

- 1. My opinion is the granting of the improvement but with the following changes, which in my judgment should be made, to-wit: This is not the right location for this road.
2. The width should be 30 feet. Also the road should go up the right side of the creek and not go up the hill.
3. Estimated compensation and damages, due each person, firm or corporation (with a * before the name of each minor or other person under disability), to-wit:

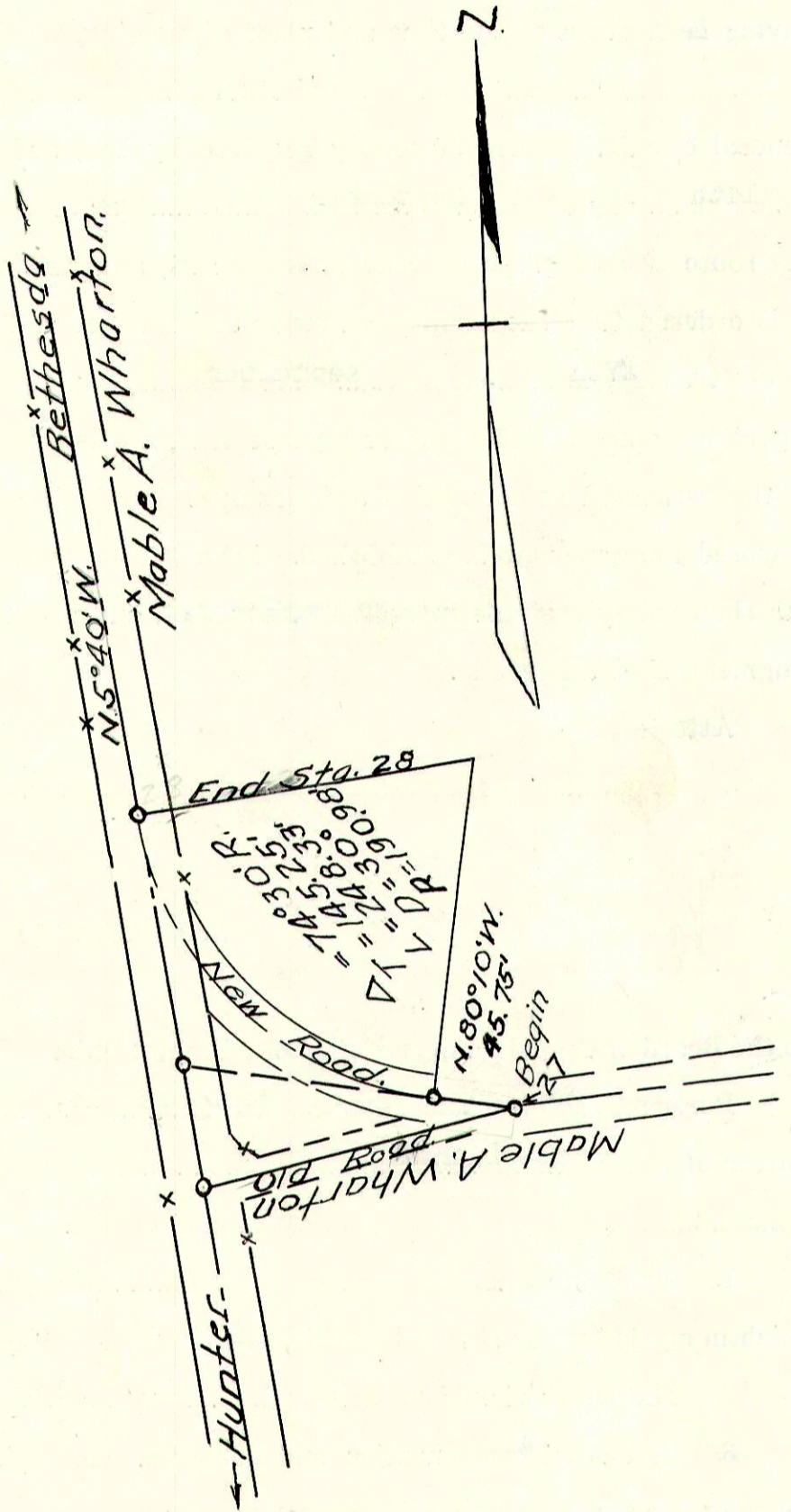
