SURVEYOR'S REPORT ON ROAD

Surveyor's Office, Belmont County,

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

St. Clairsville, Ohio, July 21, 1940

Pursuant to your order dated June 11, 1940, I make my report to you as follows, in the matter of the alteration of the public road petitioned for by C. W. Jarrett and others.

- that it should be granted as it furnishes better allignment, also the old road may be lost
1. My opinion is _____ the granting of the improvement but with the following changes, which in my judgment should be made, to-wit:
in the present location.
 2. The width should be from a minimum of 40 ft. to 115 ft. as shown on plat. feet
 3. Estimated compensation and damages, due each person, firm or corporation (with a * before the name of each minor or other person under disability), to-wit:

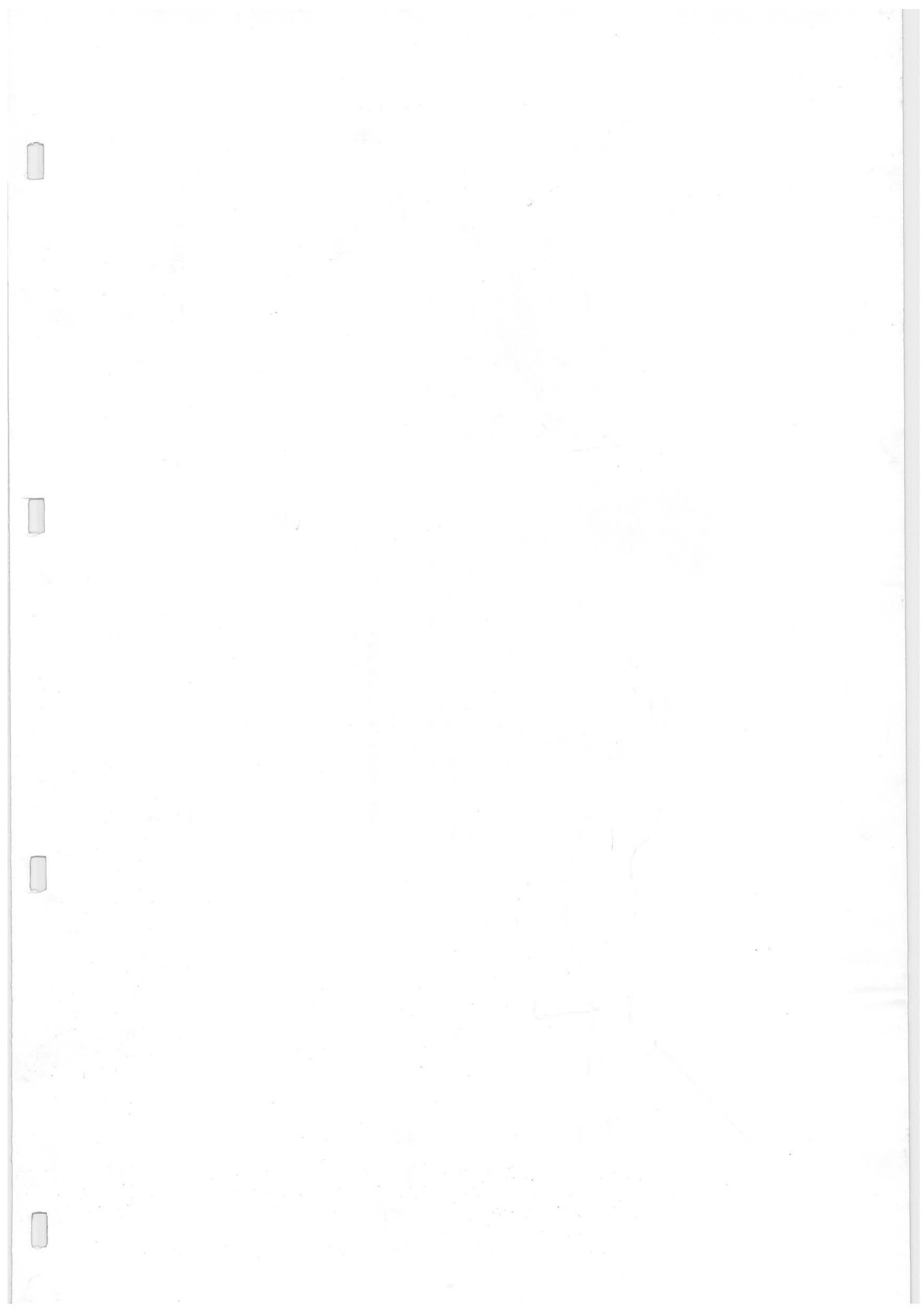

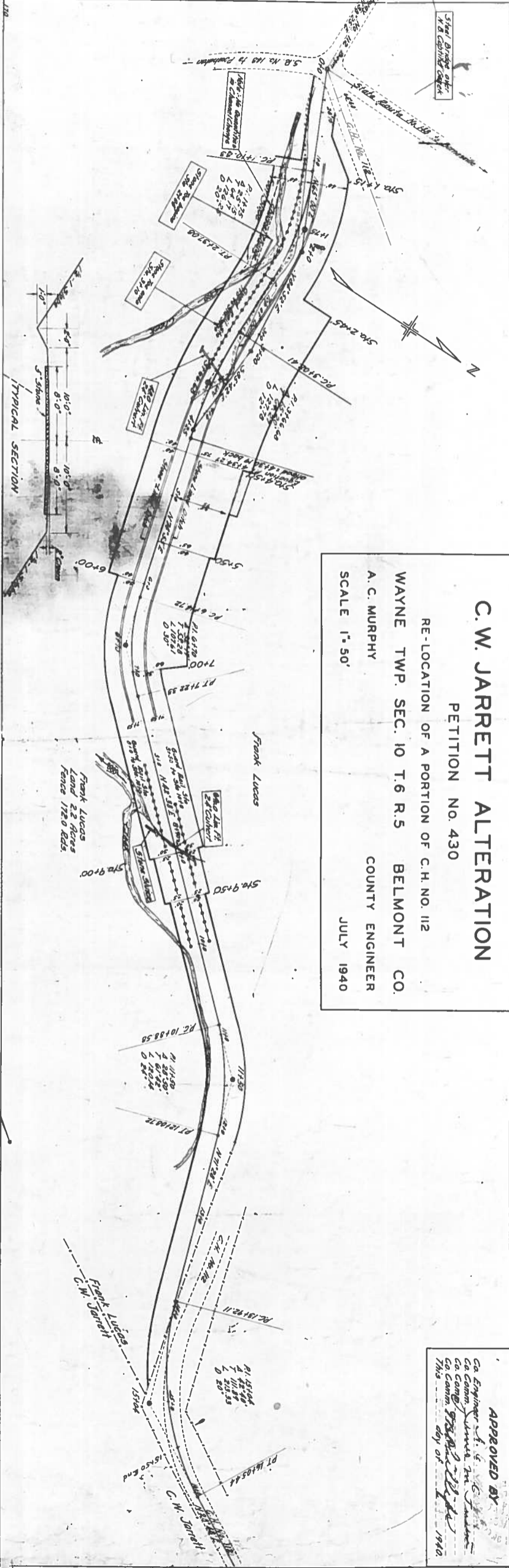
