

ROAD PETITION

For the Vacation of The Major ~~the~~ Road in Wheeling Township,
 Improvement No. 588 Petitioned for by The Pittsburgh Consolidation Coal Co. and Others
TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY, OHIO:

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the Vacation of a Public Road on the line hereinafter described and pray that you will institute and order the proper proceedings for said improvement, to-wit: Beginning *at a point at the intersection of Township Road No. 387 (Major Road), said point being located about 2110 feet North of the South Boundary of Section 3 and about 7 feet East of the West Boundary of Section 3, Wheeling Township (T. 9), Range 5; thence following along Township Road No. 387 (Major Road) and generally following the boundary line between Sections 3 and 9 in a southerly direction about 2123 feet to the South Boundary of Section 3; thence continuing in a southerly direction and generally following along the boundary line between Sections 2 and 8, about 2210 feet; thence leaving the section line and in an Easterly direction about 885 feet; thence in a southerly direction about 261 feet to a point which is located about 793 feet East of the West Boundary of Section 2 and about 2550 feet south of the North Boundary of Section 2; said township road as described, having a length of 5479 feet or 1.04 Miles more or less. The scope of the herein petition for vacation of Township Road No. 387 (Major Road) is intended to include all of Township Road No. 387 (Major Road) located in Sections 2, 3, 8 and 9, Wheeling Township (T. 9), Range 5, Belmont County, Ohio, all of which is grown up with vegetation and inaccessible.*

It is further ordered, that notice of the time and place of both such view and hearing be given by publication once a week for three consecutive weeks in the Times-Leader, Martins Ferry, O. a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the County of Belmont.

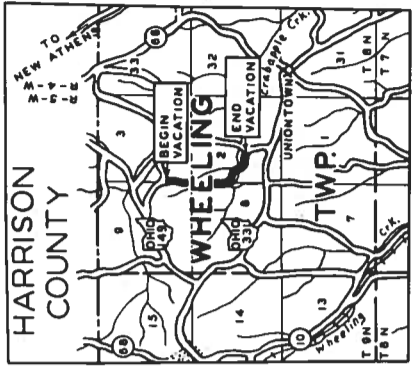

SCALE OF MILES

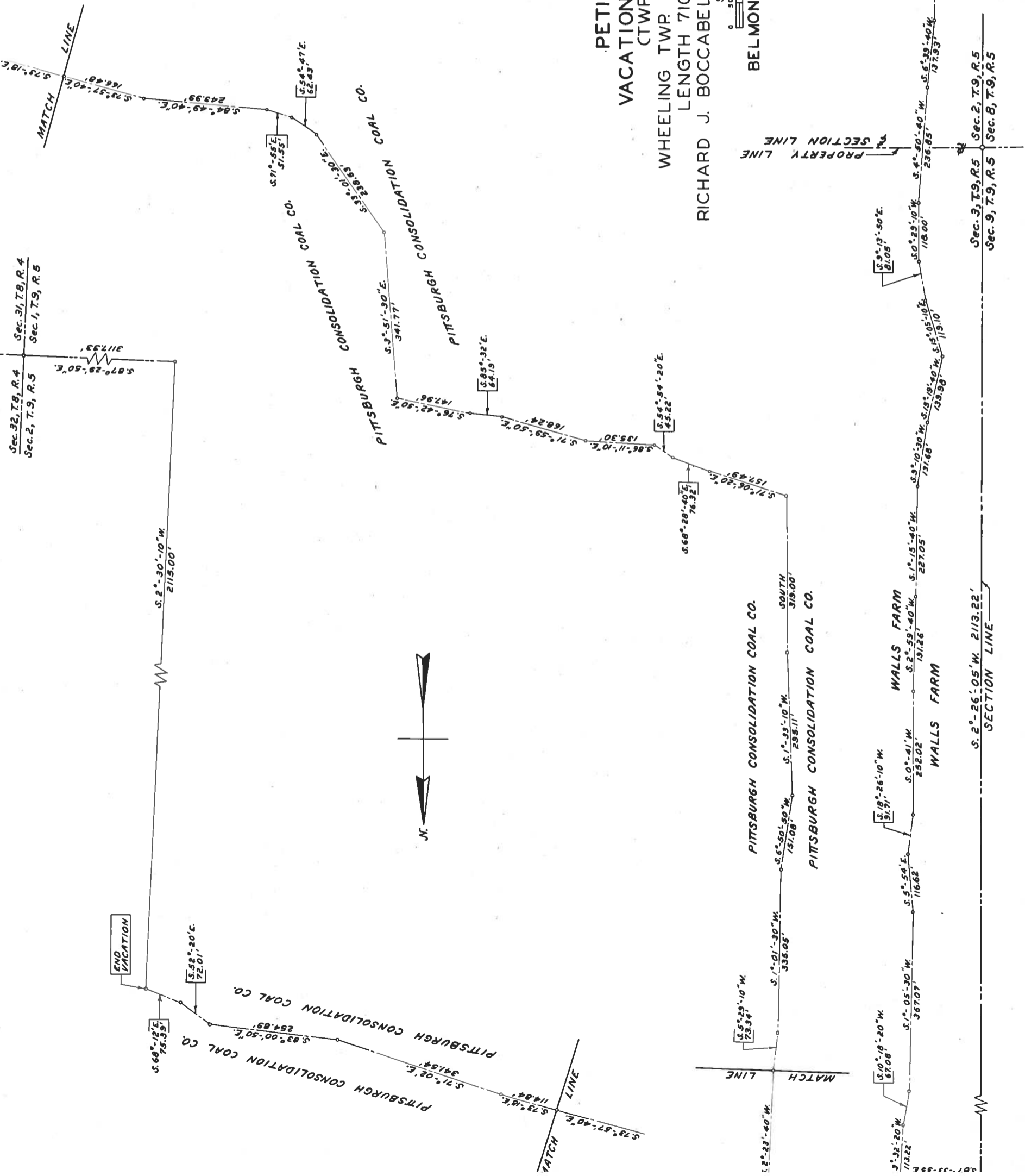
