

ROAD PETITION
For Change of County Road in Pease Township
Petitioned for by R. A. Ring Et al.

To the County Commissioners
of Belmont County, Ohio,

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said County, respectively represent that the public convenience requires that that part of the state road leading from Martins Ferry, in said county, leaving said city west of the right of way of the Cleveland & Pittsburg Railroad, passing thence through Burlington to the Jefferson County line, at or near Yukville, Jefferson County, Ohio, be improved as follows:-

First:- By establishing and opening a County road from a point in the center of Fifth street where the same intersects Center Street in Martins Ferry, and thence in a northeasterly direction with the center of said Fifth street. so far as said street is now opened, thence in a northeasterly direction to a point in the present established road where the line between the tract known as the Clark, Smith & Bennett tract and the lands of Mrs. Geo. Horcher intersect said road.

Second:- By altering said road, between the following points, a point in Spring Street in Burlington, West of the right of way of the Cleveland and Pittsburg Railroad Company and not more than 106 feet therefore and the covered bridge on the present road where the same crosses Glens Run, said alteration beginning at the first described point and running thence in a northeasterly direction west of the said right of way of said C & P. R. R Co. to said covered bridge,

Third:- By altering said road by changing its course as follows; commencing at a point west of the right of way of the C & P. R. R. Co in a road established by the County Commissioners of Belmont County, at their June session in 1887, at a post-tree opposite the second telephone pole planted south of the present crossing of said road over the Cleveland and Pittsburg Rail road near the east line of Section 19, Township 4, of Range 2 in Pease Township, Belmont County, Ohio; thence in a northerly direction and west of the right-of-way of said railroad company to and on the lands of J. D. Sauters to an intersection with the

Report of Viewers.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your March 4 session, A. D. 1901, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Bond Surveyor, at Martins Ferry, on May 2nd 1901 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

If any Viewer is unable to attend here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

Jas H Cooper and J H Helsley were selected by us as chain carriers, and Joseph Reason as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration of County Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

Commenced said alteration at a gas pipe in the center of 5th street on the N line of center street in the City of Martins Ferry, Belmont County, Ohio. Thence along 5th St N 43° 12' E 34.22 poles, thence N 61° 28' E 29.82 poles to S side of Cliff St. Thence from the S side of Cliff St across St. through the Laughlin mill, mill property to Sta 4. 

The Commissioners met in regular session, and the following action was this day taken by Board in relation to the above proposed dedication of J. E Hunt and Wife.


