

ROAD PETITION.

For Establishing ————— Road in Wheeling Tp.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders, of said County, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the establishment of a county road on the line hereinafter described, and pray that your body will institute and order the proper proceedings in the premises to view, lay out, establish and open such road, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the road leading from St. Clairsville to Harrisville near the residence of D W Coleman; thence in a southeasterly direction between the lands of John McGrew and John Huth to the section line between sections Nos 7 and 8; thence east along said section line between the lands of the said John McGraw and John Huth to the south-east corner of said section 8; thence south along the east line of section 7, about 600 feet, between the lands of John McGraw and Alonzo Fulton, and Samuel Coleman; thence in a south-easterly course through the lands of Samuel Coleman to the center of Section 1; thence in a direction north of east through the lands of John L Coleman and the Adena Railway Company to a point intersecting the public road on Cox's Run. All of said proposed road located in Wheeling township, Belmont County, Ohio.

The Conditions of the above obligations are such, That whereas application has been made to the Board of Commissioners of said Belmont County for the establishment of a county road on the following line, to-wit:

Now if the said applicants shall pay into the Treasury of the said County the amount of all costs and expenses accruing thereon, in case the prayer of said petitioners shall not be granted, or when the proceedings had in pursuance thereof shall not be finally confirmed and established, then this obligation to be void; otherwise to be in full force in law.

The Commissioners met in special session at their office, and the Board being satisfied that the foregoing petition was signed by at least twelve freeholders of the County, residing in the vicinity of the establishment of said county road, and that the proper notices had been given according to law, bond filed, approved and accepted, thereupon the Board appointed Wm Gillespie, Clarke Nichol and Edward Simpson three disinterested freeholders of the County, viewers, and John A. Pond surveyor of said proposed road, to meet at the residence of W. C. Coleman on the 23rd day of July 1902, at 10 o'clock A.M. for the purpose of discharging their official duties relative to the object prayed for in the foregoing petition. And the Auditor is authorized to notify all non-resident land owners by publication, as required by law.

Report of Viewers.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your July session, A. D. 1892, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Bond Surveyor, at Dolanman's residence on 23rd of July and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

If any Viewer is unable to attend here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

David Coleman, Alonzo Fult and James Coleman were selected by us as chain carriers, and John Sells as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed County road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the establishment of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said road ought to be opened and established for the following reasons:

First, a short route to Blaineville, second, better grade than old road, third, a great benefit to the public.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such County road shall be established 33 feet in width.




