

ROAD PETITION.

For Establishing Road in Kirkwood Tp.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

We the undersigned electors of Belmont County respectfully ask your Hon. body to lay out and establish and cause to be opened a county road on the following line to-wit: Beginning for the same in the

N E qr of Sec. 11 in Kirkwood Tp at an iron post near the foot of the hill on the road leading in a South eastern direction from the residence of Charles A Murphy past the residence of A W Collins, thence with the base of said hill about 40 rods through the lands of Charles A Murphy in the N E qr of Sec 11; thence about 70 rods through the lands of A H Bethel in the N W corner of S E qr of Sec. 11; thence continuing with the base of said hill about 25 rods through the lands of Charles D Wayt in the N E corner of the S W qr of Sec. 11 to a road now running in a North eastern direction through the S W qr of Sec. 11 past the residence of Chas A Murphy, and for such you will ever pray.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your April 4th session, A. D. 1894, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Pond Surveyor, at home of A. H. Bethel on April 26th and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

If any Viewer is unable to attend here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

Walton Ralston and Edward Frayer were selected by us as chain carriers, and John Corbin as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed County road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the establishment of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said proposed county road ought to be granted for the following reasons:

First, that its granting reduces the grade; Second, that it connects two neighborhoods by practically a level road, and also shortens the distance and gives A. H. Bethel an outlet.





To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said County, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the establishment of a County road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order the proper proceedings in the premises to lay out and establish such road, to wit: Beginning on the public road that runs north and south of a point near the dwelling house on the lands of John S Hutchinson, in Richland township, Belmont County, Ohio; thence west through the lands of said John S Hutchinson and James Pollock a distance of about eighty rods; thence south through the lands of said James Pollock about thirty rods to the public road that leads past the Pleasant Grove school house; thence following said public road in a westerly and south-westerly direction to a point in said road a short distance south-west of the said Pleasant Grove school house; thence in a south-westerly direction through the lands of Clark Nichol and M. A. Clipp in an intersection of said line with the St Clairsville and New Athens turnpike, all of said line of said proposed road lying and being in Richland township, Belmont County, Ohio.

The Commissioners met in regular session and final action on this matter having been deferred at the session held Mar. 9th, 1904, and the Commissioners having made due and careful investigation, are of the opinion that said road should be established as recommended by the viewers, from station one (1) to station six (6) as shown by the report and plat, but are of the opinion that the compensation and damages awarded said viewers in case of the establishment of said road from Station one (1) to Station six (6) viz:

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated Dec. 8th 1893, proceeded on the 22nd day of Dec. 1903, to survey and mark the establishment described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Commenced at an iron pin driven in public road near the residence of John Hutchison from which a sugar tree 6" in diameter bears N 30° 10' W 30 links and a sugar tree 6" d. bears N 62° 10' W 42 links; thence S 82° 20' W 22.14 poles to Sta. 2 on the lands of John Hutchison; thence S 87° 50' W 35.92 poles to Sta. 3 on line between John Hutchison and James Pollock; thence N 85° 27' W 27.89 poles to Sta. 4 at head of run on lands of James Pollock; thence S 81° 00' W 18.96 poles near a gate at the head of a ravine on the lands of James Pollock; thence S 4° 34' W 35.00 poles to Sta. 6 in center of public road and line between James Pollock and Moses Hutchison & thence N 85° 28' W 72.77 poles along the center of public road to Sta. 7; thence with the center of public road N 87° 45' W 24.04 poles to Sta. 8; thence S 79° 33' W 18.76 poles to Sta. 9 in center of road; thence S 73° 03' W 3.99 poles to Sta. 11 on roadside; thence S 56° 03' W 12 poles to Sta. 12 on lands of Clark Nichol; thence S 47° 18' W 7.64 poles to Sta. 13 on lands of M a Clipp; thence through said lands S 44° 55' W 64.65 poles to Sta. 14; thence S 62° 40' W 12.52 poles to Sta. 15 on lands of M a Clipp; thence through the lands of said Clipp S 81° 45' W 49.40 poles to Sta. 16 - a harrow tooth driven in center of St Clairsville and Cadiz pike and end of Clipp's lane making the entire length 444.96 poles = 1.3905 miles.
