

## ROAD PETITION.

For Alteration Road in Flushing

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said County, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the altering of a County Road on the line hereinafter described; and pray that your body will institute and order proper proceedings in the premises to alter such road, to-wit:

In Flushing Township, beginning in the road leading from Pig-Stillwater Creek, up Six-Mile Run, and at the line between the lands of John C Huff and R D Campbell; thence with said line in a southerly course about 37 rods to land of W E Murphy; thence in a southeasterly course about 37 rods on the easiest and best grade, through said W E Murphy's land to the Ridge Road, known as Murphy's Ridge.

full force in law.

# Report of Viewers.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your November session, A. D. 1894, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Pond Surveyor, at home of W. E. Murphy on Nov. 29th, 1904 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

If any Viewer is unable to attend here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

David Humphrey being absent we appointed J. H. Dunn to fill the vacancy.

Walton Ralston and W. E. Murphy were selected by us as chain carriers, and R. D. Campbell as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the alteration of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said Road ought to be granted for the following reasons:

That it will be a public benefit

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such road shall be established 30 feet in width.

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The Commissioners met in regular session, and the report of the viewers in favor of the alteration of said road was this day publicly read for the third time, and said viewers having filed a separate report in writing of the amount of compensation and damages which they have assessed to landowners, by reason of the alteration of said road through their several premises, which report was also publicly read; and the board being of the opinion that the compensation and damages awarded by said viewers to the several claimants to-wit:

## Surveyor's Report.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated Nov. 15th 1894, proceeded on the 29th day of November to survey and mark the proposed county road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Beginning at a stone planted in the middle of Six mile Run road from which a hickory tree 8 inches in diameter bears  $S 71^{\circ} 56' W 80\frac{1}{2}$  links and a triple ash tree bears  $S 26^{\circ} 30' E 102\frac{1}{4}$  links; thence along the line between John C Huff and R D Campbell  $S 4^{\circ} 00' W 57.56$  poles to a stone on the southwest corner of John C Huffs  $37\frac{1}{2}$  acre tract; and southeast corner of R D Campbells 20 acre tract; thence  $S 33^{\circ} 05' W 8.29$  perches through lands of W E Murphy to station No 3 in timber on hillside; thence along hillside through said timber  $S 7^{\circ} 54' E 1.76$  P. to Station No 4; thence  $S 49^{\circ} 54' E 4.$  poles through timber to station No. 5; thence  $S 60^{\circ} 39' E 6.48$  P to Station No 6 in timber; thence  $S 53^{\circ} 59' E 9$  poles to Station No. 7 in timber; thence  $S 73^{\circ} 47' E 12.56$  P to station No 8 in timber; thence  $S 85^{\circ} 00' E 9.64$  P to station No 9 at edge of woods; thence  $N 76^{\circ} 15' E 13.60$  poles to station No. 10 in a private road; thence along said private road  $S 78^{\circ} 15' E 6.60$  poles to station No. 11 in said private road; thence  $S 53^{\circ} 00' E 16.43$  poles along private road to station No. 12 in center of the Murphy Ridge Road from which a black walnut tree 6 inches in diameter bears  $S 74^{\circ} 36' E 47$  links; and a black walnut tree 8 inches in diameter bears  $S 0^{\circ} 30' E 15$  links.
