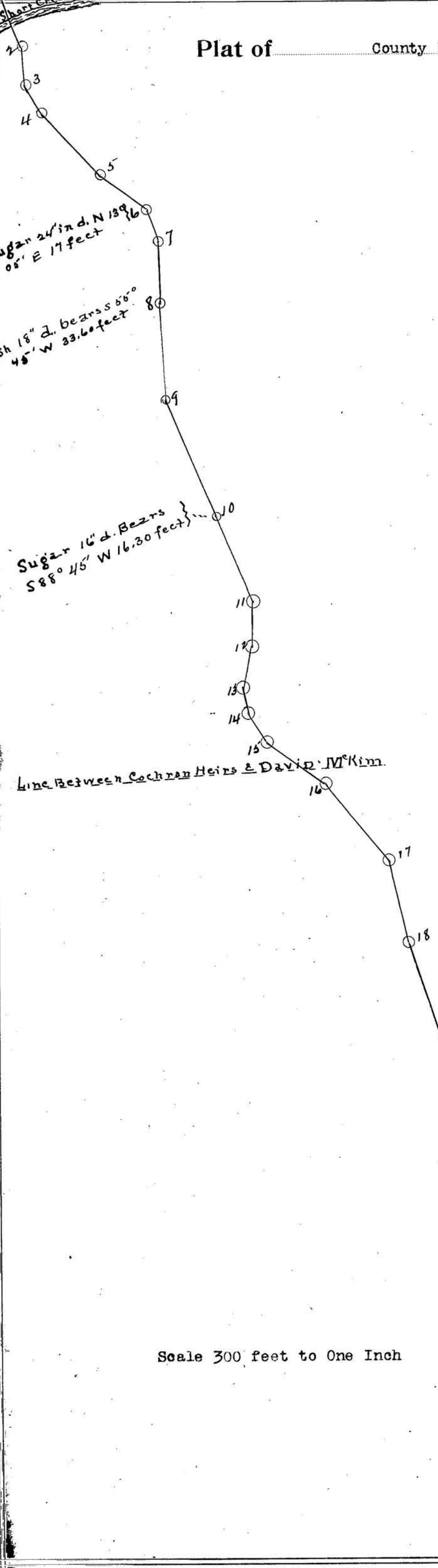

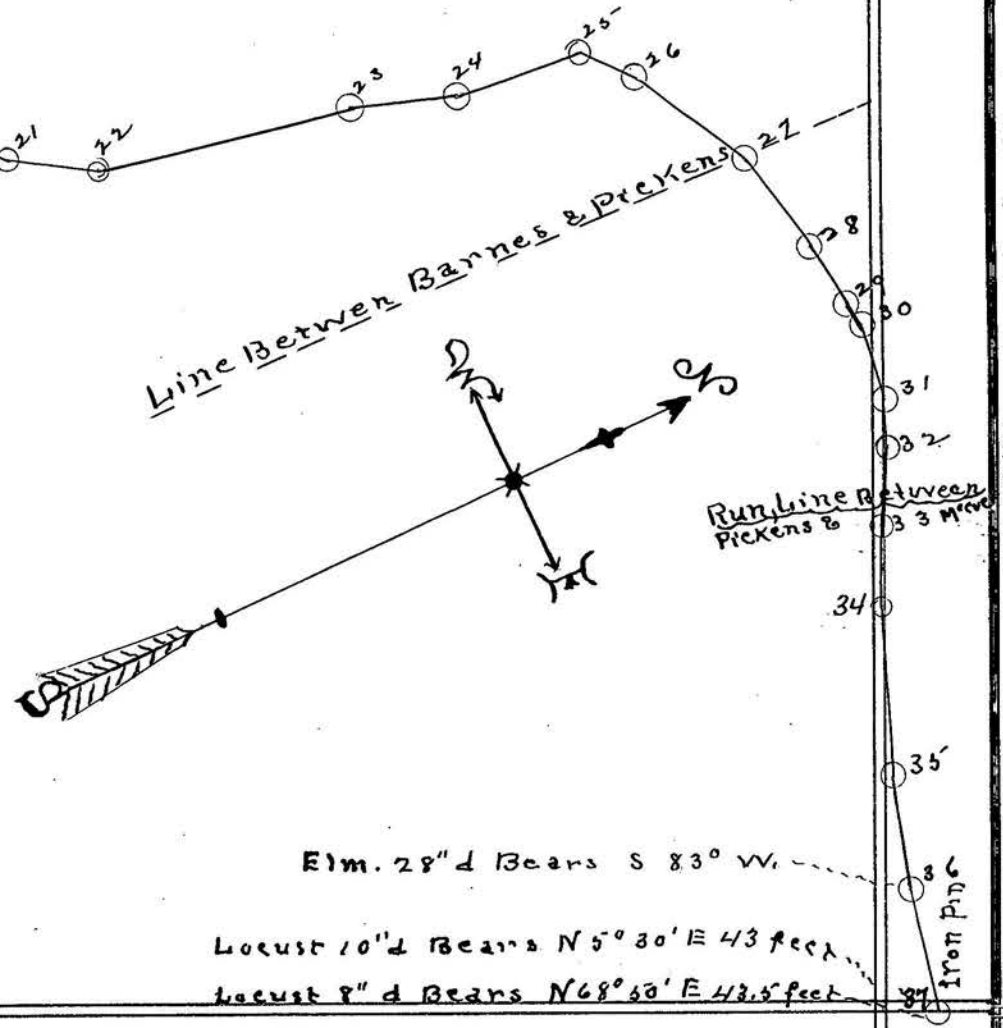
Plat of County Road Road.
