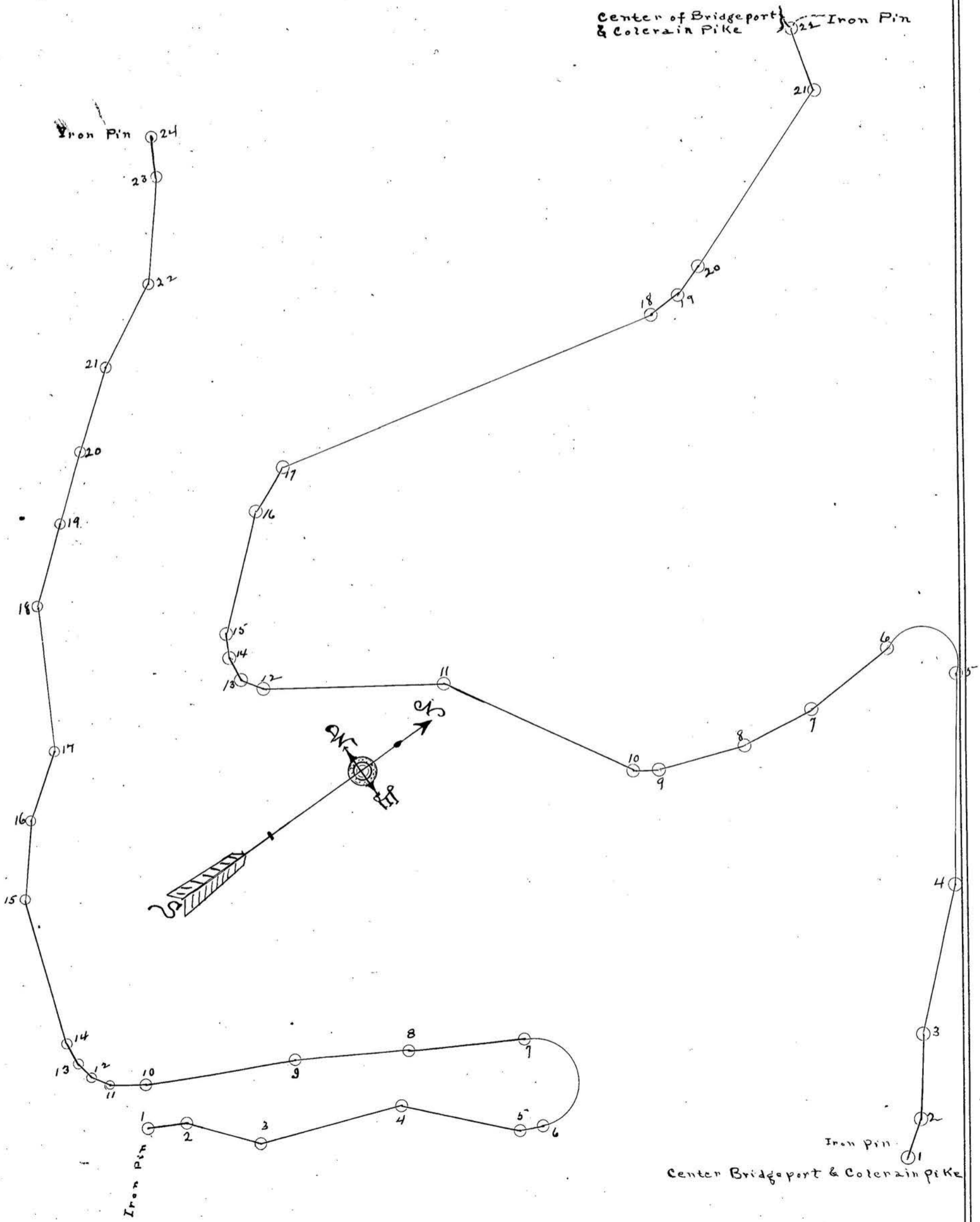

are reasonable and just; that said road will be of sufficient importance to the public to justify the payment of said Compensation and Damages out of the County Treasury, including in said payment the \$174.00 paid into the County Treasury by A. A. Jones, Principal petitioner and no petition for review having been filed, it is ordered that the County Auditor draw his order upon the County Treasury in favor of said Claimants for the amount of Compensation and damages so awarded to them respectively; that the several reports of the viewers with the survey and plat of said road be recorded and that said road be established a public highway 30 feet in width; that the County Auditor issue his order to the Trustees of Kirkwood Township to open said road according to law.
