To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

We the undersigned do hereby petition the Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, for the alteration and change of a certain piece of road leading from armstrongs to Bethesda in Goshen Township, through the lands of Nathan Kep, and George Ewers, as follows:-- To commence at the southwest corner of the Hickory Grove or No. 4 school lot; thence east along a byroad to a joint between the residence and Barn of Nathan Kem; thence south on the east side of a spring house to a small cherry tree on the line between Nathan Kemp and George Ewers; thence in a southeast direction across certain lands of George Ewers to intersect the Armstrong and Bethesda Road at or about an opening in said field, seven rods west of the line between George Ewers and Levi Ewers.

In obedience to your order, issued at your May 14th, 1906 session, A. D. 189 , we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Bond Surveyor, at Nathan Kemp's on May 23, 1906 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

Walton Ralston and G. R. Banfield, were selected by us as chain carriers, and William Patterson as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said Proposed Alteration ought to be Established for the following reasons:

First;- The View made by us was the most practicable and of public utility, evading a grade of 8° 29'- Second:- It is a good grade probably about 2° . Third:- It is a shorter distance. Fourth;-- Gives a public wateringtrough. Cost of Making should not exceed \$50.00.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Proposed Alteration shall be established 30 feet in width.

# Surveyor's Report.

**To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:**

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated May, 14, 1906 1894, proceeded on the 14 day of May, 1906 to survey and mark the Proposed Alteration described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

W. Corner of School Lot, District No. 4 from which point a White Oak 26 " D. bears N. 00° 45' E. 46 feet; thence through lands of Nathan Kemp S. 84° 50' E. 164.30 feet to station No. 3 from which the N.
