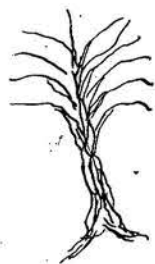

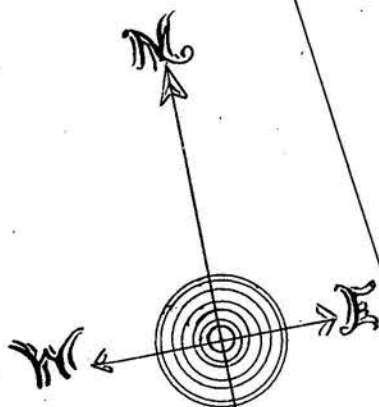

Eastham, near the line dividing the land of said Eastham and John Clark, said point being about 150 feet south of a run; thence by the most practicable route through the lands of James and H. Eastham, Edward Foster, John Clark, and land of A. C., M. J., M. B. and E. A.
