

ROAD PETITION.

For The Establishment Road in Smith Township

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned petitioners, resident freeholders of said county respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the establishment of a new road, said road to begin at a stake near a wild-cherry tree in the Lamira and Warnock Road, west of the residence of A. P. White and running from thence in an easterly direction through the lands of John Wilson near the southern boundary of said lands to a stake near a forked appletree east of a coal bank on the lands of the said John Wilson; thence on to the lands of C. W. White and following as near as possible the curvature of the hill to a gate near the boundary line between the lands of the said C. W. White and the land used by the B. & O. R. R. Company; thence east through the lands of the said C. W. White near the northern boundary of said lands to a stake on the lands of P. P. Russell; thence east to a stake near a slight elevation of land on the lands of the said P. P. Russell; thence around the said elevation following as near as practicable the curvature of the hill to an ending at an appletree in the public road running N. & S. through the lands of said P. P. Russell.

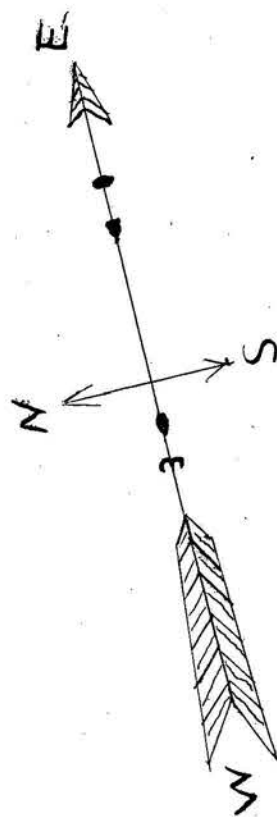

We then proceeded to view said proposed Road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said Road ought to be Established for the following reasons:

That the old road in its steepest part is on a grade of 16 feet elevation in the 100 feet length and at points gets almost impassible at certain seasons of the year. And we would further recommend that the maximum grade of the new road shall not exceed 11 feet elevation to the 100 ft. which grade we believe to be quite practical.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Road shall be established 40 feet in width.

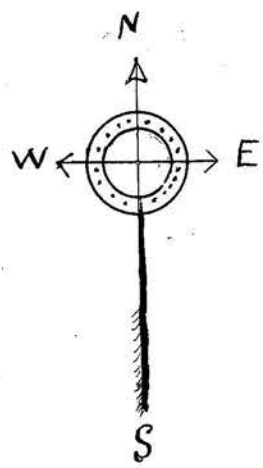
