

ROAD PETITION.

For J. C. Berry Road in Washington Township

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

To the Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio.

Your petitioners residents of Washington township in said Belmont County respectfully pray for the alteration of the county road leading up Captina Creek through the lands of Hannah Perkins situated in the central part of section 28 in Washington township in Belmont County and state of Ohio, said alteration to be as follows:

Commencing at a post on the north side of said road on the line of lands of said Hannah Perkins and Tillman W. Saffell in the central eastern part of said section 28 thence running in a westerly direction along the north said of said road passing 20 feet north of a sugar tree snag (notched) and intersection a fence at a post (notched) and running along north side of and near to the fence on the north side of said road to a black walnut tree 8 inches in diameter (notched) thence in a westerly direction to a honey locust stump in a line of cross fence (notched) thence in a westerly direction the hill side to a buckeye snag in line of cross fence, thence in a westerly direction on a line parallel to and 5 feet distant north of a fence to a small apple tree (notched) thence in a westerly direction on a line 22 feet south of a cabin dwelling house and terminating at the point of intersection of the state road and said county road on the north bank of Captina creek in said section 28

Said proposed line of road commences on passes through and terminates on the lands of said Hannah Perkins.

In obedience to your order, issued at your Nov. 14th session, A. D. 1910, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with Arthur Dickson Surveyor, at Alledonia on and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

Percy Oldham and R.C. Lucas were selected by us as chain carriers, and T.W. Saffell as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said alteration ought to be granted for the following reasons:

The old road as at present located is too low and near the creek, is flooded and gorged with ice in winter time when the creek is high thereby rendering it impassable much of the time and cannot be permanently improved with reasonable expense.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such alteration shall be established 30 feet in width.

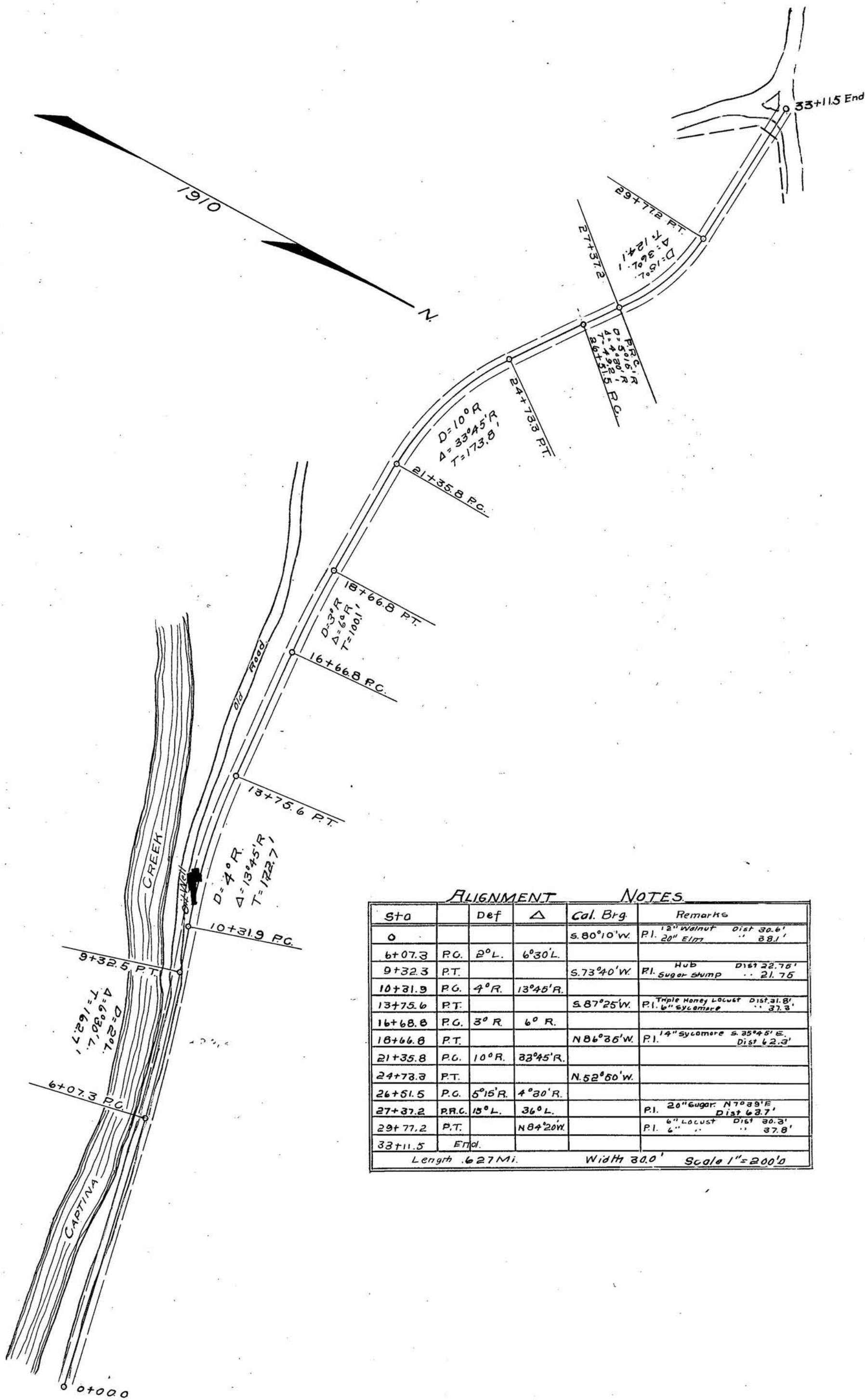

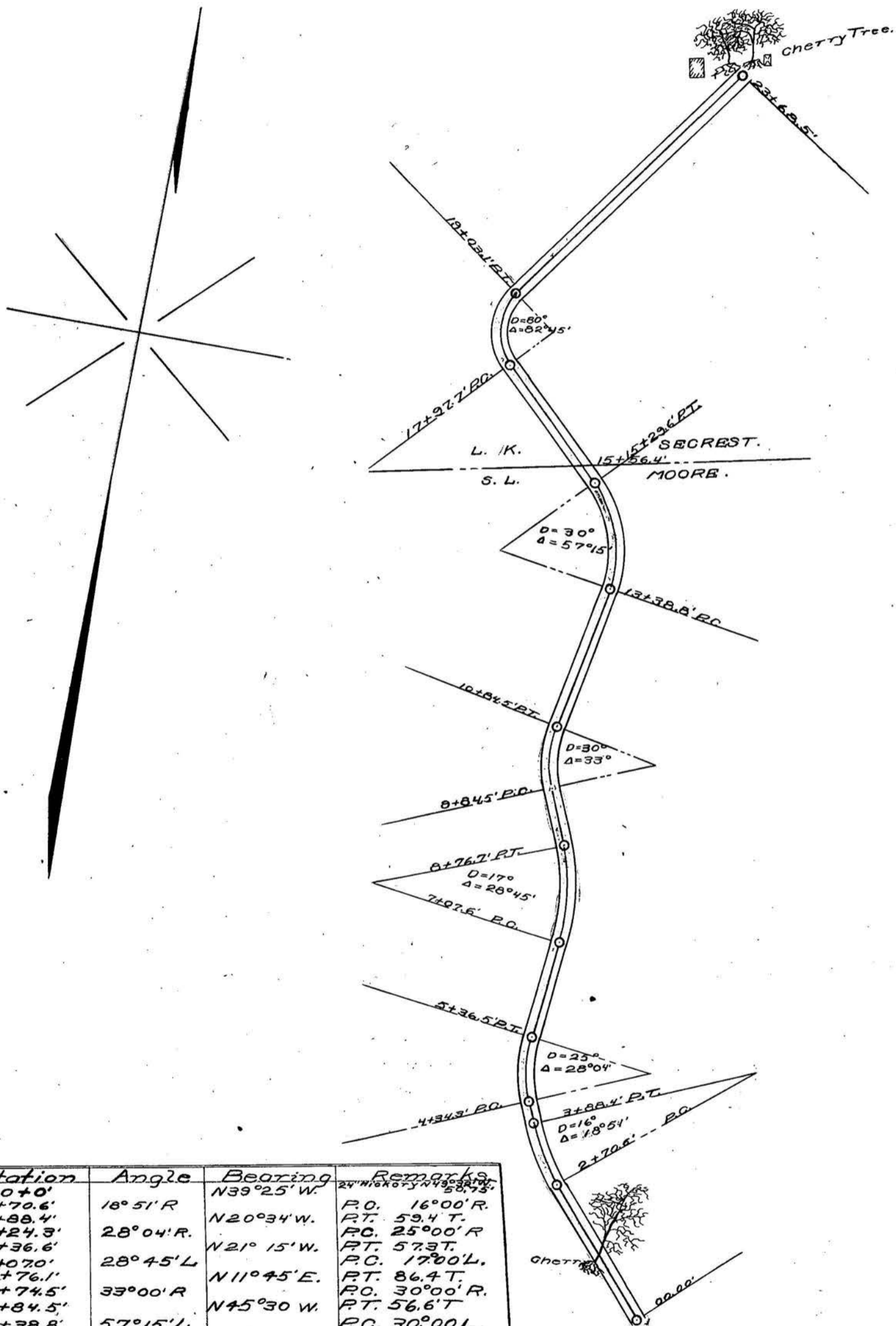

The undersigned petitioners resident freeholders of said county, residing in the vicinity of the proposed improvement hereinafter described, respectfully represent that the public convenience requires the alteration of the middle portion of the county road leading from Laming, to intersect the Loydsville - Belmont road in Richland township, said county and state, near the residence of Wm Lauty on the line hereinafter described, and pray that your body will institute and order the proper proceedings in the premises to alter such road, to wit: Beginning for the same at a stake in the center of said road in Richland Twp. on the lands of S. J. S. Waddell and near his residence, thence on the lands of S. J. S. Waddell north 1950 feet to a post on the line between S. J. S. Waddell and E. J. Foreman and J. A. Foreman, thence northwest on the lands of E. J. & J. A. Foreman 1050 feet to an elm tree on the line between the lands of E. J. & J. A. Foreman and John E. Lutz thence on the lands of John E. 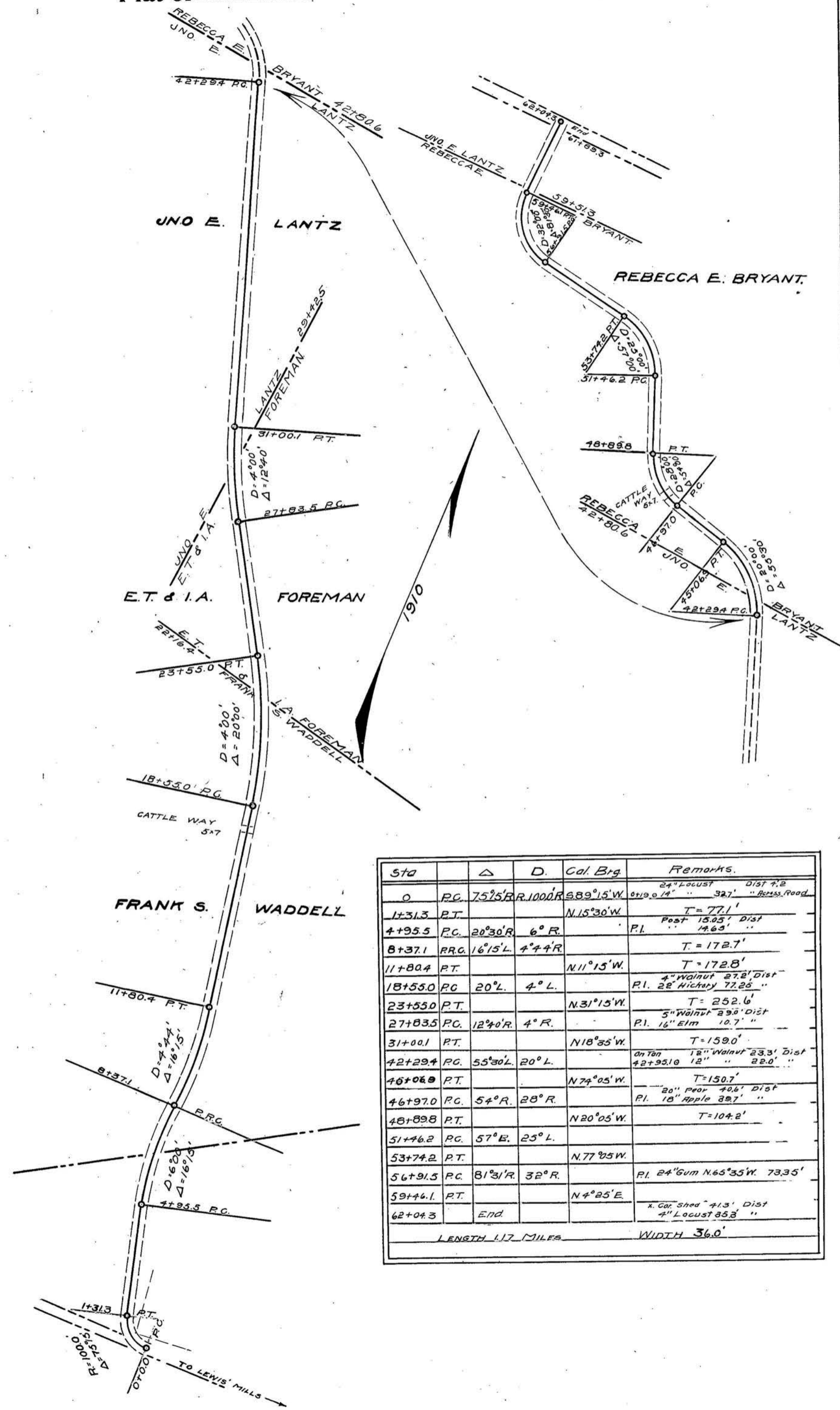
