To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

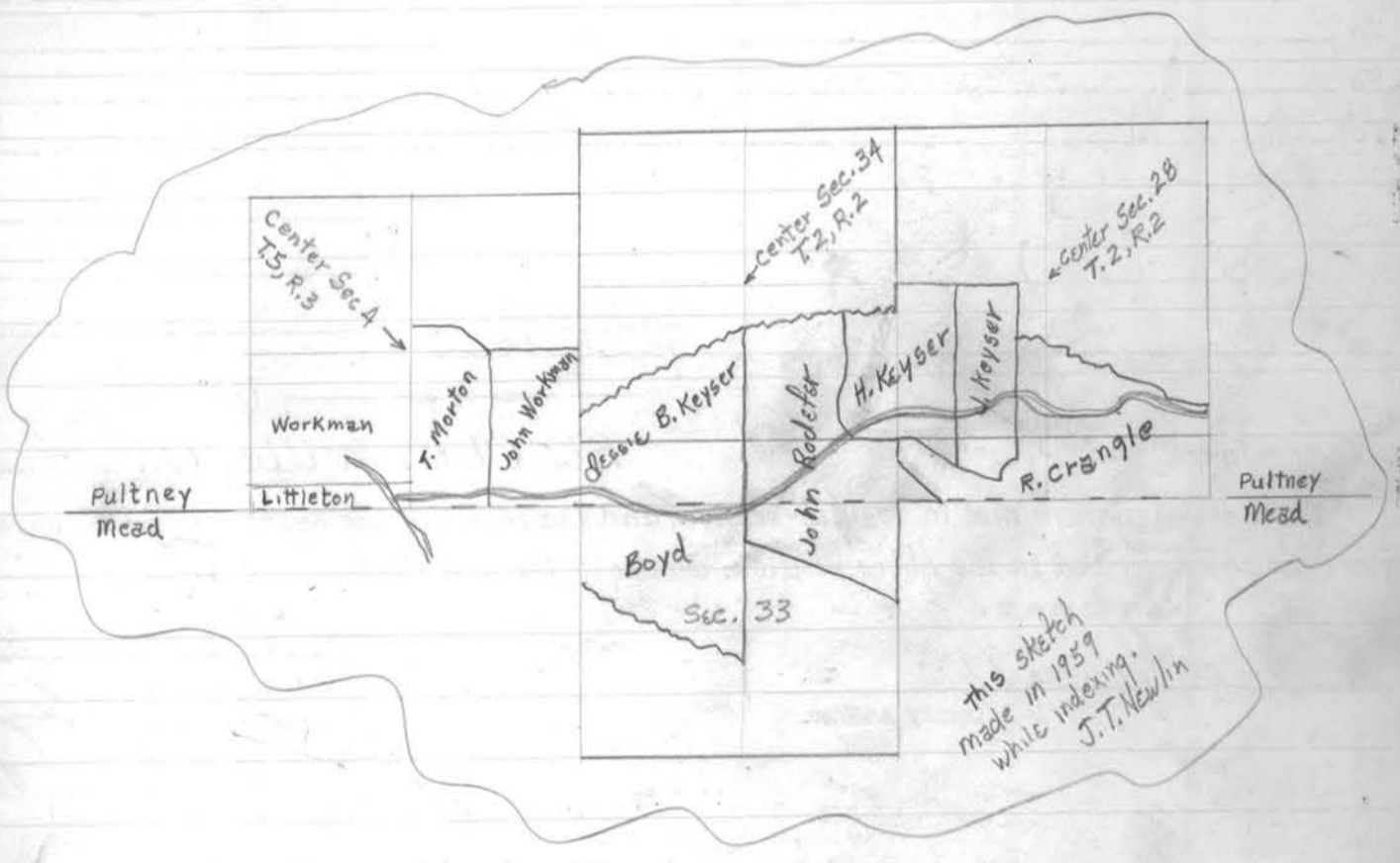
