

 The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated September 9<sup>th</sup> 1881, proceeded, on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of October to survey and mark the route of an alteration of a County road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Plat and Survey of an alteration of a County road petitioned for by Robert A. Duncan and others, made under the direction of the Viewers of said road. Beginning at a stake on the old road leading from the Dillies Bottom road to the St. Clairsville and Harrock Pike in said County on the lands of Rebecca M<sup>o</sup> Grew deceased, where a corner of a stable bears N 65° E 4.52 per distant thence N 31 1/2° W 14.12 per thence N 30 3/4° W 5.12 per. Thence N 9 3/4° W 4.96 per. Thence N 2° E 12.36 per. to a stake in the old road from which a thorn bush 8 in. diam. bears N 31 1/2° W 1.88 per. distant and there to terminate.

# REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your September session, A. D. 1881, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed, under said order, met with James Crosgrove Surveyor, at William Chambers on Oct 3<sup>d</sup> 1881 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order. And Thomas Lodge one of the viewers appointed by your Hon. Board failed to appear, and thereupon we appointed David Johnson a judicious disinterested freeholder of Belmont County, to fill said vacancy

Richard Meek and John Watson were selected by us as chain carriers, and William M<sup>o</sup> Drew as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

That we in our opinions think that a good road can be made at a very reasonable expense, and also that the said change will be of great convenience to the public in regard to travel and for a more full description of said route and change see Surveyors report herunto attached

We would respectfully report that the said Alteration ought to be made for the following reasons:



D. 1881, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with Marshall Thompson Surveyor, at Barlows Station on October 7 1881 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

George Mitchell and Charles Wells were selected by us as chain carriers, and Hugh Roberts as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed \_\_\_\_\_ on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the \_\_\_\_\_ of said road as follows:

We would respectfully report that the said alteration of said road ought should to be made between the points last above for the following reasons: named, because the public convenience requires it, and a good road can be made along the line surveyed at a trifling expenditure of money and labor. We are further of opinion that the public convenience will be fully subserved if said road between said last points above named is established thirty feet wide. We are further of opinion that the alteration petitioned for between Station No 22 1/2 of the surveyors report and at which a stone bears  $N 33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E 1.16 rods, and the terminus as petitioned for ought not to be established because a good road cannot be made on or near the line proposed by the petitioners and also because in our opinion the petition was deficient in description of line sought to be altered. Given under our hands this 17th day of October A D 1881.
