

SURVEYOR'S REPORT.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

The undersigned, in obedience to your order, dated Mar 11 1887, proceeded, on the 19th day of April to survey and mark the country road described in said order, under the direction of the Viewers therein named, and respectfully submits the following return of said survey:

Beginning at a point in the Morristown and Somerton road as determined by the viewers, thence with the supposed bed of old road N 47° 30' E 30 poles; thence N 13° 30' W 6 poles; thence N 27° 45' W 30 poles; thence N 17° 45' W 35 poles; thence N 29° 45' W 44 poles; thence N 11° 15' E 38 poles; thence N 10° 45' W 30 poles; thence N 37° 45' W 34 poles to a point near the intersection of the old Morristown and Somerton road and the road up Long Run as herein described; thence N 6° 15' E 28 poles; thence N 22° 45' W 27 poles; thence N 13° 45' W 22 poles; thence N 45° 45' W 29 poles; thence N 81° 45' W 24 poles to a point 5 poles on bearing S 25° 10' W from the intersection of township road with a by road up Long Run; thence N 86° 45' W 29 poles; thence N 71° 45' W 58 poles; thence N 45° 45' W 30 poles; thence N 76° 45' W 34 poles; thence N 64° 45' W 21 poles; thence N 86° 45' W 24 poles; thence N 39° 45' W 14 poles; thence N 62° 45' W 30 poles; thence 47° 45' W 37 poles; thence N 3° 45' W 22 poles; thence N 8° 45' 5 poles to the center of country road at Dora P. REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your March session, A. D. 1887, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Bond Surveyor, at School House on April 18 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

Lewis Smith and Chas Patterson were selected by us as chain carriers, and A. J. Smith as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed renewal of road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the viewer of said road as follows:

commencing at the starting point in section 24 in Wayne Township following the field notes up Long Run, to Dora Post Office in Goshen Township and we think it impossible to make a road on the northern part of said survey say for one mile. By moving a short distance from survey a good road could be made and it is evident a road is very much needed the full length of said survey. A good road could be made on the survey on the southern end. A township road connects with said road about one mile south of Dora, which north end seems to be an actual necessity for quite a number of citizens.


