

The Conditions of the above Obligations are such, That whereas application has been made to the Board of Commissioners of
 said Belmont County for the Alteration of a County road on the following line, to-wit:

Commencing for said alteration near a
 culvert south of Pleasant Grove School
 House running thence N.E. to intersect
 the Bridgeport Free Turnpike at a point
 about $\frac{1}{4}$ rods east of said School house

Now if the said applicants shall pay into the Treasury of the said county the amount of all costs and expenses
 accruing thereon, in case the prayer of said petitioners shall not be granted, or when the proceedings had in pursuance
 thereof shall not be finally confirmed and established, then this obligation to be void; otherwise to be in full force in law.

The Commissioners met in Regular session at their office, and the Board being satisfied that the foregoing petition was signed by at least twelve freeholders of the county, residing in the vicinity of the Alteration of said county road, and that the proper notices had been given according to law, bond filed, approved and accepted, thereupon the Board appointed W. G. McComas, Jno Starbuck, W. H. Shewell three disinterested freeholders of the county, viewers, and Jno A. Bond surveyor of said proposed road, to meet at T. C. Mercer's 10 o'clock A.M. January 16, 1894 for the purpose of discharging their official duties relative to the object prayed for in the foregoing petition. REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your December session, A. D. 1893, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with John A. Bond Surveyor, at Thomas L. Morris on January 19, 1894 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

Wm. McCormas not being able to attend Archie M. Hawthorne was called to fill the vacancy.

Mark Adams and John A. Bond were selected by us as chain carriers, and Nathan Neolin as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed Alteration on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the Alteration of said road as follows:

Commencing at a stone (about 4 Rods S. W. of a culvert) in the middle of the road running thence in a North Easterly direction 26.8 Rods to a stone planted in the center of the said Bridgeport-Free Turnpike a little S. E. of the point designated in the petition.

In our opinion the alterations hereby contemplated render unnecessary the following described part of the original road to wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the proposed new road and running thence North to the intersection of the Bridgeport-Free Turnpike.

We would respectfully report that the said Alteration ought to be Established for the following reasons: - To wit:

It shortens the distance to the Bridgeport Free Turnpike; obviates a heavy grade; and makes a much better and safer approach to the said pike; and can be constructed at very little expense. And will be of great public utility.

We have also determined that the public convenience requires that such Road shall be established 33 feet in width.

SEPARATE REPORT OF VIEWERS.

The Commissioners met in regular session, and the report of the viewers in favor of the establishment of said road was this day publicly read, being the third reading of the same. And said viewers having filed a separate report, in writing, of the amount of compensation and damages which they have assessed to land-owners, by reason of the location of said road through their several premises, said report was also publicly read. And the Board being of opinion that the compensation and damages awarded by said viewers to the claimant, to-wit: To Jno. C. Johnson Fifty Dollars Compensation and One hundred and five Dollars Damages. Total One hundred and fifty five (\$155⁵⁰) dollars is reasonable and just but that said road is not of sufficient importance to the public to warrant the payment of compensation and damages out of the County Treasury, it is ordered that the petitioners pay, or tender to pay, the claimant, forthwith one half of the total amounts so as aforesaid assessed to them, and that no further proceedings be had in the premises, until such payment or tender shall have been made.


