To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

We the undersigned freeholders of Belmont Co do hereby respectfully petition your honorable body for the establishment of a county road in said Belmont County Beginning for the same on the lands of Joseph Lafferty at a point directly north and east of the C & W RR crossing on the county road leading from Uniontown to Lafferty Station; Thence in a north west direction through lands of the said Lafferty along the side of the C & W RR to a point near the creek; thence on the north ~~east~~ side of the creek to a point near an elm tree; thence across the creek and along the side of the C & W RR to a point on the line between the lands of Joseph Lafferty and F. A. Brewer; thence along the side of the C & W through the lands of said Brewer to a point on the line between the lands of said Brewer and A. J. Keyser; thence through the lands of A. J. Keyser to the most convenient point on the county road leading from the Uniontown and Flushing pike to the old Cleoland Mill.

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio:

In obedience to your order, issued at your 12-12 session, A. D. 1894, we the undersigned, Viewers appointed under said order, met with Geo A Bond Surveyor, at Sufferly Sta on July 9, 1895 and were severally sworn to discharge, faithfully and impartially, the duties required of us in said order.

If any viewer is unable to attend, here state by whom the vacancy was filled.

John Riley and Geo A Bond were selected by us as chain carriers, and S S Starkey as a marker, who were also duly sworn.

We then proceeded to view said proposed new road on the line described in your order, and caused the same to be surveyed, "as prayed for in the petition, or as near the same as in our opinion a good road can be made at a reasonable expense, taking into consideration the utility, convenience, and inconvenience and expense which will result to individuals as well as the public," by the establishment of said road as follows:
