

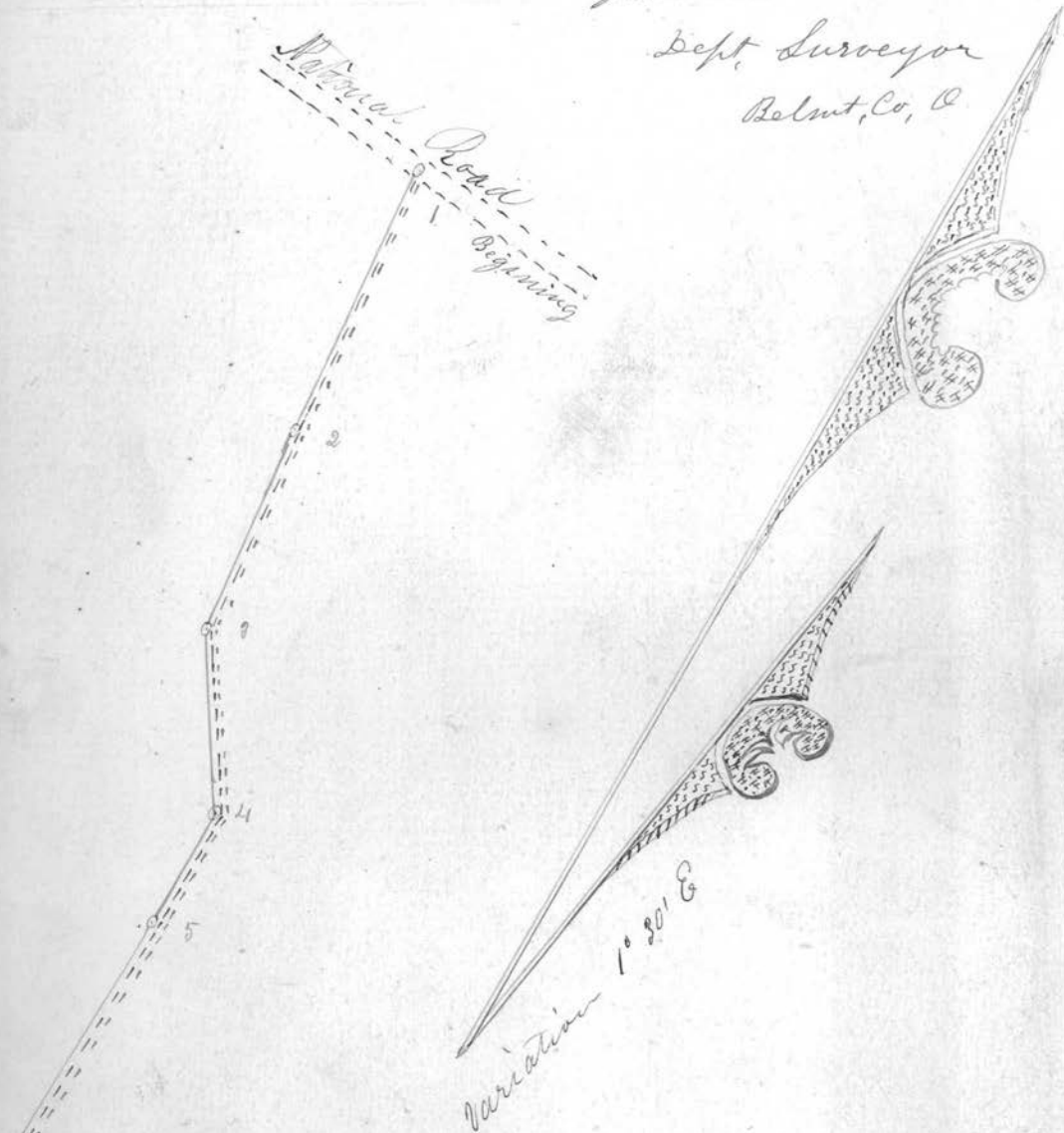
Bull's Run Road

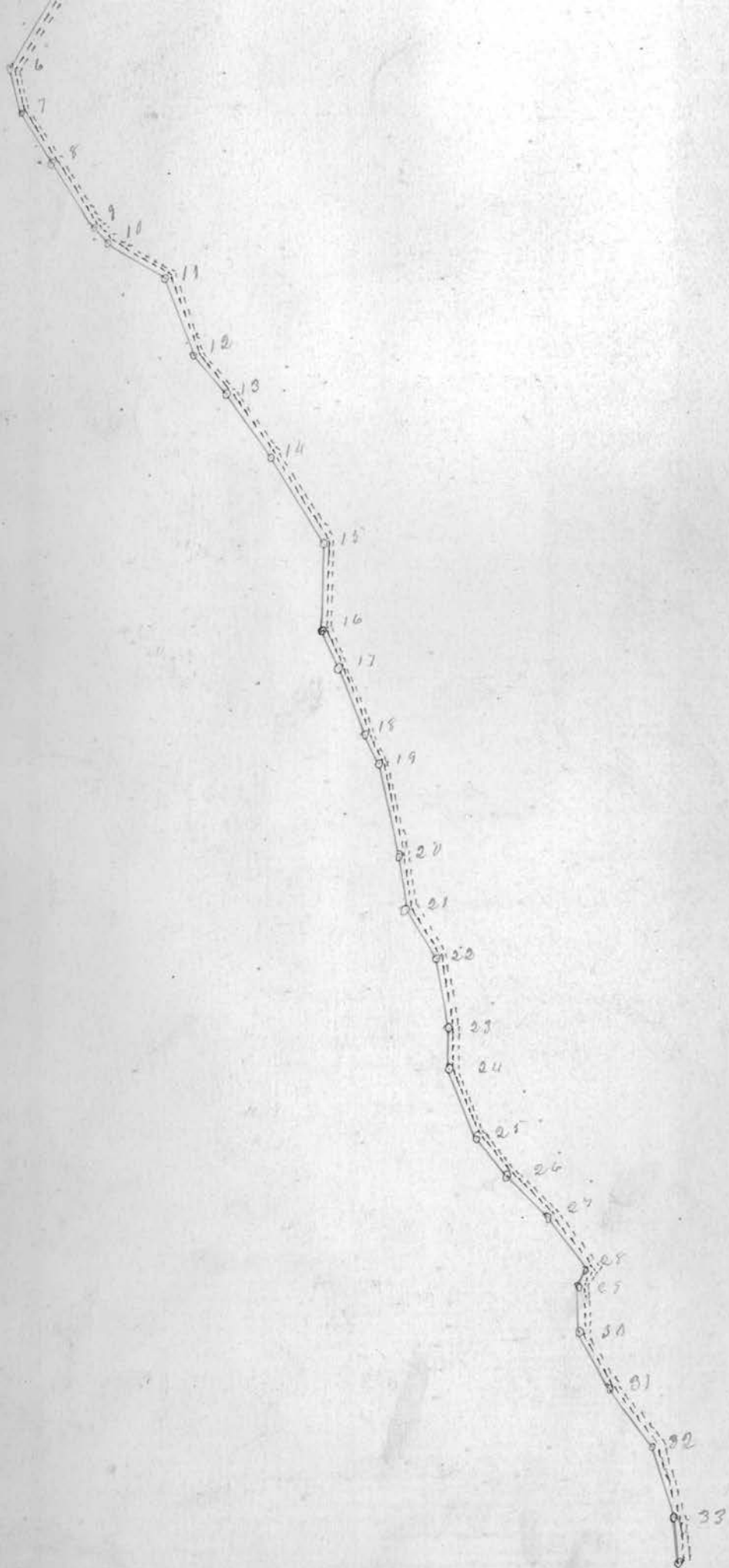

J. Alexander's Orchard, thence the courses and distances marked on the Diagram to a Red Oak tree at the mouth of Bull's Run on Little McMahans Creek near C. Shoemakers

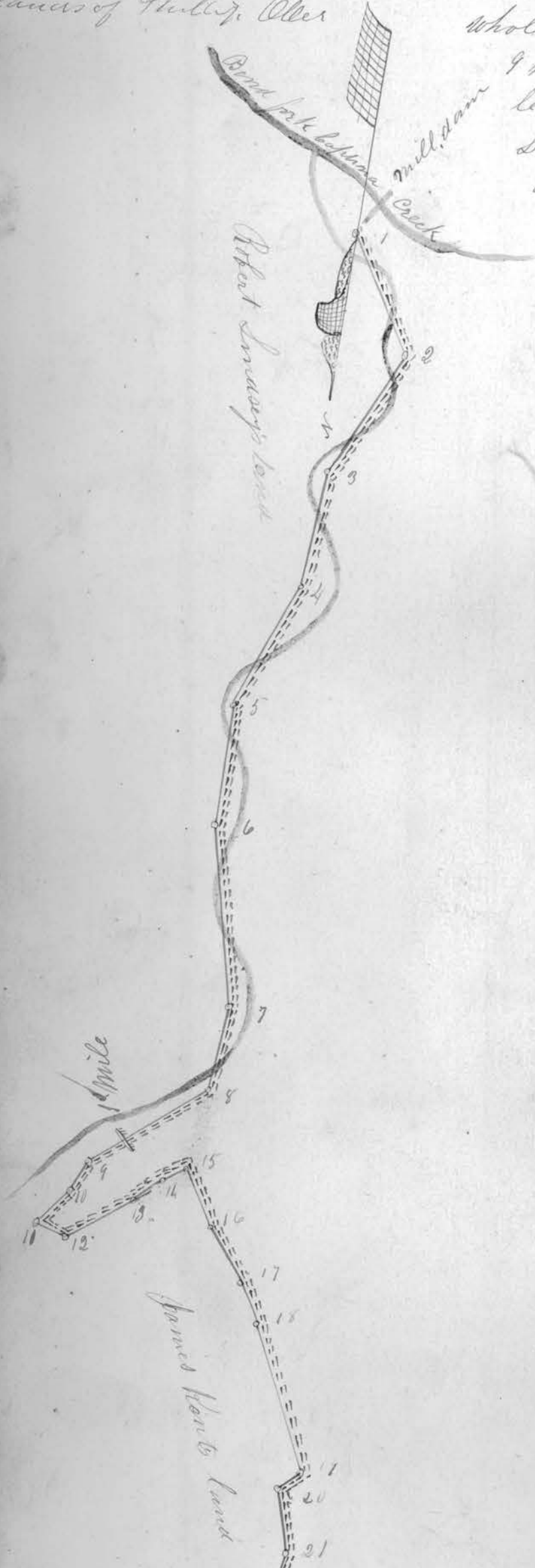


53 Red oak tree at the mouth of Arlets Run

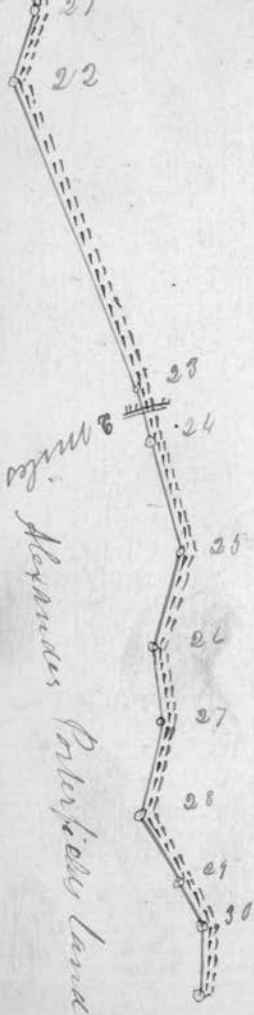

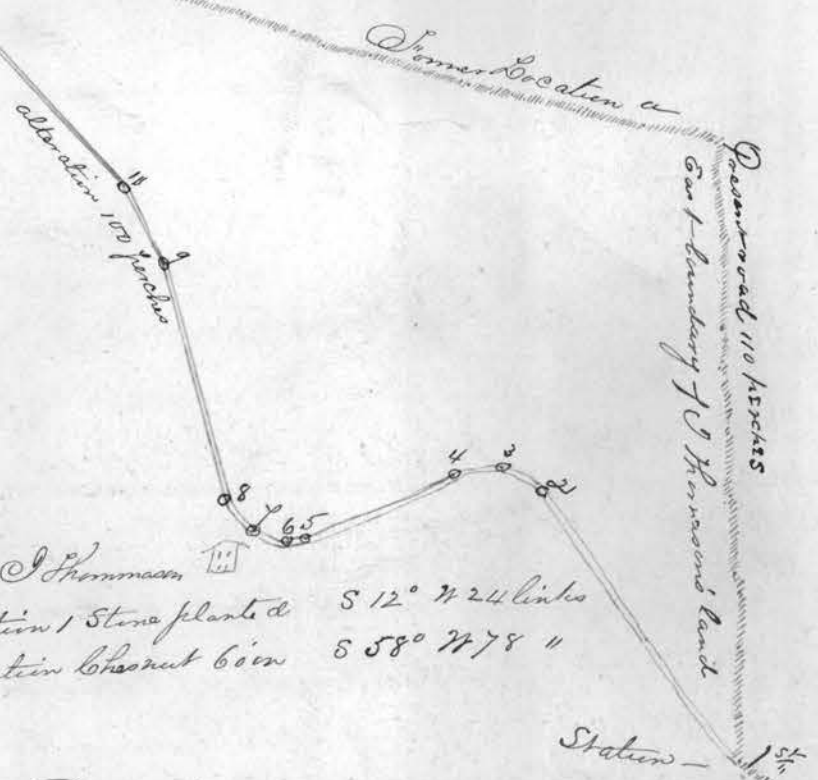
